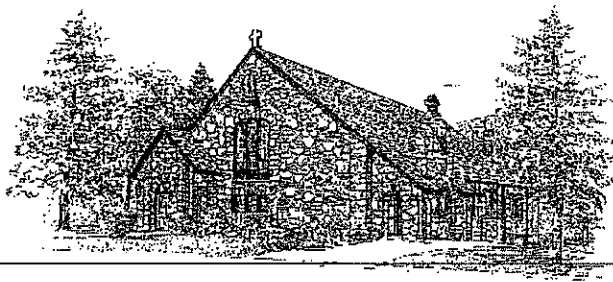

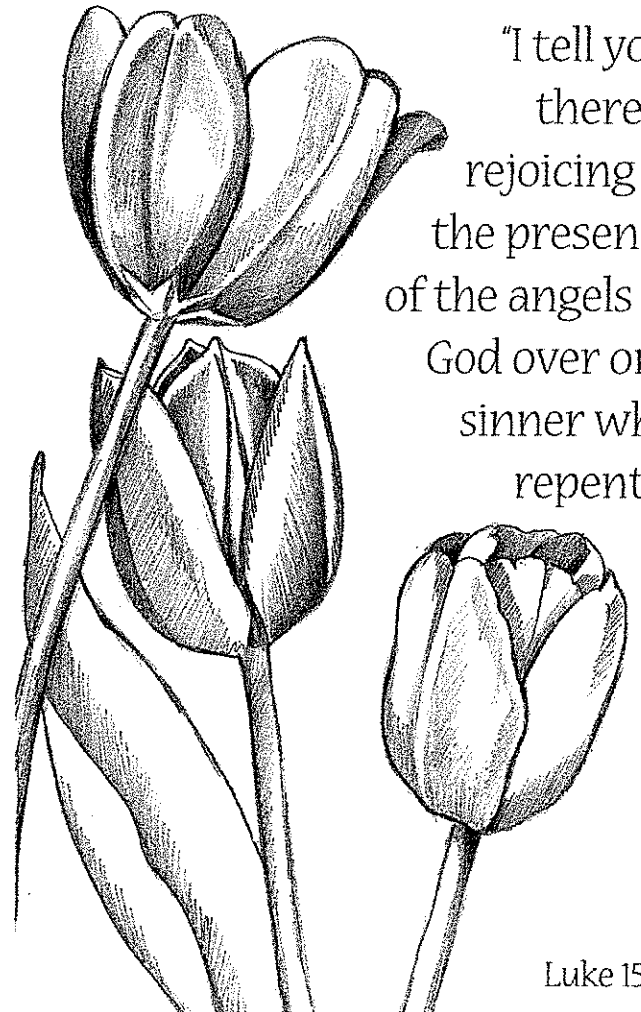
## **PARISH MEMBERSHIP**

# St. Januarius



was born in Italy and was bishop of Benevento during the Emperor Diocletian persecution. Bishop Januarius went to visit two deacons and two laymen in prison. He was then also imprisoned along with his deacon and lector. They were thrown to the wild beasts, but when the animals did not attack them, they were beheaded. What is believed to be Januarius' blood is kept in Naples, as a relic. It liquifies and bubbles when exposed in the cathedral. Scientists have not been able to explain this miracle to date. St. Januarius lived and died around 305 A.D. and his feast day is September 19th.

## Feast of San Gennaro in NYC

The annual Feast of San Gennaro returns to Little Italy for 11 days, stretching Sept. 12 through Sept. 22. The Feast of San Gennaro dates to 1926 when Neapolitan immigrants wanted to continue the September 19 feast day observed back home.

To this day, thousands of people make a pilgrimage to Naples to celebrate Saint Januarius, the city's patron saint, and see the miracle of his blood. The blood, which is said to be kept in a sealed glass vial, is said to liquefy about three times a year.

The feast also was a way for Italian immigrants to celebrate their heritage. After being told they would be relegated to worship in the basement of other churches, dominated by Irish Catholics, the community built its own church.

Over the years, the Feast of San Gennaro has grown to 11 full days of celebration, food and drink.

Msgr. David Cassato will bless the stands on Thursday, Sept. 12 at 6 p.m. On Sept. 19, the solemn high Mass celebrating the Patron Saint of Naples will occur at 6 p.m. at the Shrine Church of the Most Precious Blood (113 Baxter St.), which will be followed by a religious procession with the statue of San Gennaro.

The Grand Procession is slated for Saturday, Sept. 14 at 2 p.m., when there will be floats, bands, celebrities, the Red Mike Festival Band, the Giglio Band and the statue of San Gennaro.
