Expectations

Staff

- Will ensure that the catechists are trained and will provide support in a loving, Christian environment
- Will prepare the curriculum to be used for each grade level
- Will handle any medical or behavioral problems that may arise

Parents

- Will ensure that their children attend classes regularly and on time
- Will communicate to catechists and staff any special needs or circumstances that may affect their child in the classroom
- Are encouraged to be an active part of their children's learning at home as well as be involved at the catechist's request (e.g. help with special programs and projects)
- To be a Catholic Christian example attending Catholic Mass weekly and attend refresher courses in catechism as needed

Students

- Will behave in a Christian manner at all times
- Will be respectful of and cooperative with any adults helping with the program
- Will participate in classroom activities and discussions
- Will attend class regularly and complete any homework given
- Will honor the code of conduct
- Will not swear, degrade, or use any offensive language on the church grounds

Catechists

- Will provide a loving, Christian atmosphere within the classroom where children can learn
- Will prepare for class and teach the designated curriculum
- Will provide a Christian role model for the children and help them feel they are special children of God
- Will communicate with parents about their children and involve them in the learning process

Discipline and Problem Solutions

Students are expected to share in the faith learning experiences of our program. We understand that discipline problems are usually caused by needs that aren't being met. However, if a child's behavior continuously disrupts the learning process for him/herself or for others, the following steps will be implemented.

1. At the first incident, the child will be verbally reminded of expected behavior and consequences of misbehavior.
2. After the second incident, the child will be sent to the office for a discussion of appropriate behavior with Director of Religious Education.
3. After returning to class, if inappropriate behavior continues, the child will be sent to the office to do their classwork for the duration of the class time. The child's parent will be called to pick up the child and discuss the situation.

If the child's behavior continues to disrupt learning, it may be necessary for the parent to instruct the child at home.

After working through steps 1-3, the child may be allowed the opportunity to rejoin the class if an understanding can be reached as to how all those involved may best continue to learn and grow in faith.

Note: Students are expected to exercise care in use of classroom furniture and supplies (pencils, art supplies, tables, chairs, etc.). Should a student cause destruction to any classroom materials, the parent may be asked to replace those materials.

Medication and Health Concerns

Any medication or health concerns should be brought to the attention of the director or assistant at the time of registration. This includes identification of ADD, ADHD, ASD, OCD, anxiety, and chronic illnesses (e.g. diabetes, heart condition, severe allergies, epilepsy, etc.). It is our policy **not** to administer any medication to students because of the relative brevity of classes. If a child is diagnosed with any medical condition after registration, please inform the director or CCE assistant as soon as possible. This information will be kept confidential between the office staff and the child's catechist.

Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

Please help us maintain a safe environment for our children by following these procedures. Please check your calendar before bringing your child to class.

CCE and Sacrament Classes

Please make every effort to have your child arrive on time. They should be in the classroom when the session starts. If your child arrives more than fifteen (15) minutes late, they will be marked absent. Late arrivals are disruptive to the class.

Please do not open classroom doors or take your child from the classroom until the class is dismissed. Children leaving early are disruptive to the class.

Guidelines & Expectations Confirmation I

- ❖ Confirmation I is part of The Teen Confirmation program that takes a total of two years.
- ❖ Teens who have been baptized and received their First Eucharist, can prepare for the sacraments of confirmation. Typically, these are teens in 10th or 11th grade (some exceptions can be made).
- ❖ The confirmation candidate must attend the CCE classes on Sunday evening, and have good attendance with an 80% or higher percentage.
- ❖ **MANDATORY:** There is one Day of Reflection for Confirmation I.
- ❖ There are two fees that need to be paid or make arrangements for payments. One is the CCE fee, and the other is the Day of Reflection fee. Full payment is due by October 31, 2019. The confirmation candidate must be respectful and courteous to Youth Ministries Coordinator, Catechist, and fellow peers.
- ❖ The confirmation candidate must inform the Youth Ministries Coordinator on any issues during the school year, which will hamper his/her participation/completion of the Confirmation Program.
- ❖ There is to be no food, drinks, or gum inside the classroom.
- ❖ Usage of cell phones or other electronic devices are prohibited during class

Guidelines & Expectations Confirmation II

- ❖ Teens who have been baptized, received their First Eucharist, and at least one year of faith formation (or attends a Catholic school) immediately prior to the year can prepare for the sacrament of Confirmation. Typically, these are teens in 11th or 12th grade.
- ❖ The confirmation candidate must attend the CCE classes on Sunday evening, and have good attendance with a 80% or higher percentage.
- ❖ There are two fees that need to be paid or make arrangements for payments. One is the CCE fee, and the other is the Confirmation Retreat fee. Full payment is due by November 04, 2019.

- ❖ **MANDATORY:** There is one Confirmation Retreat for Confirmation II.
- ❖ The confirmation candidate must complete 2 service projects.
- ❖ The confirmation candidate can only pick one sponsor for Confirmation.
- ❖ The candidate can pick a saint's name or remain with their first name for Confirmation. If the confirmation candidate did not choose a Saint name and goes with first name and it is not a Saint name it will not be in the records. Sponsor forms and Saint's name due ***Sunday, February 9, 2020.***
- ❖ Baptismal Certificate and Birth Certificate are **required for registration.**
- ❖ The confirmation candidate must inform the Youth Ministries Coordinator on any issues during the school year, which will hamper his/her participation/completion of the Confirmation Program.
- ❖ The confirmation candidate must be respectful and courteous to Youth Ministries Coordinator, Catechist, and fellow peers.
- ❖ There is to be no food, drinks, or gum inside the classroom.
- ❖ Usage of cell phones or other electronic devices are prohibited during class.

Parking

PLEASE DO NOT PARK IN THE CLERGY PARKING SPACES OR THE FIRE LANES.

Parking in front of the fire lanes is a violation of fire code. The church can be fined for this as it is a safety hazard should an emergency occur. There are three parking lots at St. Justin as well as space to park in the street. Please arrive with enough time to find an appropriate parking spot and walk your child to class.

Please do not drive around the cones. The cones are in place for your child's safety. Please drive carefully and courteously.

Inclement Weather

St. Justin religious education classes will follow Alief ISD closures unless specifically notified otherwise.

Please check email, text, and social media if you are unsure about whether class will be held during inclement weather. You may also call the parish office at 281-556-5116. Heavy rain does not automatically cause cancellation. Please use your best judgment about whether or not to bring your child. Do not risk personal safety to make it to CCE classes.

Fire and Weather Emergency

A fire alarm must be taken seriously. It is imperative that all students, staff, and catechists depart from the facility in an orderly manner and meet at a safe, appropriate place outside. We will remain outside until the “all clear” signal is given. Exit routes are posted in each classroom. We will conduct at least one fire drill per class day during the CCE year.

In the unlikely event of a weather emergency (such as a tornado or a hurricane) during class hours, students and catechists will be asked to move to the hallway and away from windows.

Attendance

It is important for children to be present at each class. **If a child’s attendance drops below 80% during a first or second sacrament preparation year, a meeting with the Coordinator of Religious Education will be necessary to determine whether the child is ready to progress or receive a sacrament.** We will not deny a sacrament but may delay the reception if deemed necessary.

If a child is sick or must inevitably miss a class, a doctor’s note or a handwritten note from a parent must be provided in order for the absence to be excused. **Sports practices, sports events, scout trips, camping trips, or other extracurricular activities are not excuses to miss classes during sacrament preparation years.** We ask that you put your child’s faith first during these short but vital days.
