Today is the Eighteenth (18<sup>th</sup>) Sunday in Ordinary Time. When the Israelites escaped Egypt and sought a new life, God gave them quail in the evening and manna in the mornings so they could be strong for their journey across the desert. Similarly, Jesus gives us the gift of himself in the Eucharist so that we might have the strength and grace needed to persevere as we walk our pilgrim journey of faith on earth.

Please note the slight MASS SCHEDULE CHANGE for next Sunday, August 9. The 8:00 a.m. Mass moves to 7:00 a.m. and will be held at the church on the Woodbury County Fairgrounds.

As I announced last weekend, I will be departing this fall for a 2-3 month sabbatical in the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston before returning to the Diocese of Sioux City for a new assignment. My last day will be Monday September 7. Bishop Nickless has appointed Fr. Brad Pelzel as the new ADMINISTRATOR beginning September 8. He also serves as the Vicar General of the Diocese of Sioux City and thus will have other duties besides pastoral duties in the WFCC. In the coming weeks I will be briefing him on the current programs, status, and culture of the parishes so that the work we have done together for the last eleven [11] years at Immaculate Conception and seven [7] years at St. Michael will continue to progress in helping to build the Kingdom of God. Please refrain from making any pre-arrival judgments about him and welcome him with open arms on September 8.

Again, I will greatly miss the people of the WFCC. I love everyone and I love the growth I have witnessed in the parishes since I arrived in July 2004. I will continue to be dedicated to serving you until the day I depart for my sabbatical and new assignment. I will keep everyone of you in my prayers and ask for your prayers as we all begin to experience a transition in the leadership of the WFCC.



**FROM LAUDATO SI ["Praise be to you, my Lord"], ON CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME, Pope Francis:** My predecessor Benedict XVI likewise proposed "eliminating the structural causes of the dysfunctions of the world economy and correcting models of growth which have proved incapable of ensuring respect for the environment". He observed that the world cannot be analyzed by isolating only one of its aspects, since "the book of nature is one and indivisible", and includes the environment, life, sexuality, the family, social relations and so forth. It follows that "the deterioration of nature is closely connected to the culture which shapes human coexistence".<sup>11</sup> Pope Benedict asked us to recognize that the natural environment has been gravely damaged by our irresponsible behaviour. The social environment has also suffered damage. Both are ultimately due to the same evil: the notion that there are no indisputable truths to guide our lives and hence human freedom is limitless. We have forgotten that "man is not only a freedom which he creates for himself. Man does not create himself. He is spirit and will, but also nature". With paternal concern, Benedict urged us to realize that creation is harmed "where we ourselves have the final word, where everything is simply our property and we use it for ourselves alone. The misuse of creation begins when we no longer recognize any higher instance than ourselves, when we see nothing else but ourselves". [6]

**YOUCAT QUOTE:** The Youth Catechism, written in language suitable for young people, deals with the entire Catholic faith as it was presented in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The numbers after each question/answer refer to more extensive and in-depth treatments in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, CCC for short.

**Question #143: Is the Pope really infallible?** Yes. But the POPE speaks infallibly only when he defines a dogma in a solemn ecclesiastical act ("ex cathedra"), in other words, makes an authoritative decision in doctrinal questions of faith and morals. Magisterial decisions of the college of bishops in communion with the Pope also possess an infallible character, for example, decisions of an ecumenical council. [888-892] *Visine*

The infallibility of the POPE has nothing to do with his moral integrity or his intelligence. What is infallible is actually the *Church*, for Jesus promised her the Holy Spirit who keeps her in the truth and leads her ever deeper into it. When a truth of the faith that has been taken for granted is suddenly denied or misinterpreted, the Church must have one final voice that authoritatively says what is true and what is false. This is the voice of the Pope. As the successor of Peter and the first among the bishops, he has the authority to formulate the disputed truth according to the Church's Tradition of faith in such a way that it is presented to the faithful for all times as something "to be believed with certainty". We say then that *the Pope defines a dogma*. Therefore such a dogma can never contain something substantially "new". Very rarely is a dogma defined. The last time was in 1950.

**OTHER LITURGICAL MINISTRIES:** All the baptized need to understand that part of their duty regarding the Liturgy is to accept some responsibility for the Liturgy, to place themselves and their God-given talents at the service of the liturgical community whenever possible. Whether one brings up the gifts at the Presentation; reads the Word of God; assists with the distribution of Communion and brings the Eucharist to those unable to be present at Mass; serves at the altar; provides music that augments the joy, solemnity, and festivity of the celebration; or serves the assembled community as an usher, he or she is contributing to the worship of the community and fulfilling the responsibility that comes with Baptism.





**From the Code of Canon Law (the law of the Roman Catholic Church) ON THE TEMPORAL GOODS OF THE CHURCH**

can. 1281 §1 With due regard for the prescriptions of their statutes, administrators invalidly posit acts which go beyond the limits and procedures of ordinary administration unless they first obtain written faculty from the ordinary.

§2 The acts which go beyond the limits and procedures of ordinary administration are to be defined in the statutes; if, however, the statutes do not mention such acts, it is within the competence of the diocesan bishop to determine such acts for persons subject to him after he has heard the finance council.

§3 Unless and to the extent that it is to its own advantage, a juridic person is not held to answer for acts invalidly posited by its administrators. A juridic person, however, is responsible for acts illegitimately but validly posited by its administrators with due regard to sue or to have recourse against administrators who have damaged it.
