

HEAR, O ISRAEL!

In Judaism, one of the closest things to a creed is the "Shema". Its name comes from the Hebrew word for "Hear". The statement "Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone" means that Israel will serve only one God. It probably was not originally meant to say that there were no other Gods, but that the people would not follow another. Monotheism, or the belief that there is only one divinity, would come later. Orthodox Jews wear the Shema in boxes or phylacteries on their arms and foreheads. They are also placed in containers, called "Mezuzahs" at front doors of their homes.

Jesus places an emphasis on the second part of the Shema, "You shall love the Lord..." He teaches the value of a personal bond with his Father and the Holy Spirit. To this injunction Jesus adds a verse from Leviticus 19:18 "You shall love your neighbor..."

Sister Celeste Boda, who spent 10 years of service in the Army National Guard, shares her reflection and prayer on Veterans Day:



When I think of Veteran's Day, I am reminded of the following words from Lincoln's Gettysburg Address:

...It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far so nobly advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us – that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion...

These noble words pertain, not only to the dead, but to all those who still live with the scars of war, who also gave the full measure of their efforts for noble causes of freedom. And most certainly, especially in today's world, we must be dedicated to the great task remaining before us – peace and the respect for all peoples and to care for the earth. The reign of the Kingdom of God has absolutely nothing to do with "divide and conquer." All people have a right to the abundance of resources with which God endowed the earth. All people have a right to live peaceably, without fear of gangs and violence. Oh, we have a great task remaining before us – and it stretches way beyond the shores of this country or this continent.

On this day of remembrance, may we ask God for the grace to find peaceful ways to resolve our conflicts, to share our resources, and to embrace all of God's children.
