Also, in booking Masses, you may want consider an "Unannounced Mass" in place of an "Announced Mass". Unannounced Masses are \$10 and are offered as Fr. Chris' intention when available. Whether announced or unannounced, the intention is made and God's grace is granted to the deceased.
