Confessions will be heard on Thursday, September 1st from 4:15-5:00pm. First Saturday devotions follow the 8:00am mass on September 3rd.

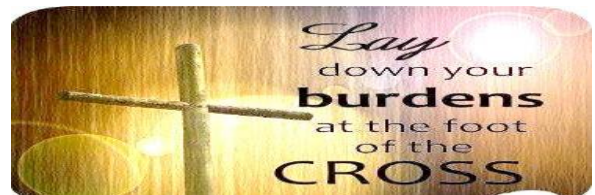

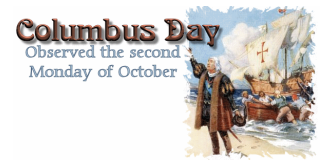

First Reading: Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29

He warned that a guest who takes the place of honor may be asked to move to the lowest place. Yet a guest who takes the lowest place is honored when a better position is offered by their host.
