Giving advice. In today's gospel, John the Baptist is telling everyone what they need to do to prepare for the Savior's arrival. But how do you tell someone not to bother sending out Christmas cards when they'll be getting one from you? Or to keep their decorations simple when your house glows for miles? How do you convince them not to get you a Christmas gift when you show up with "a little something I got you"? In other words, you're telling people: "Do what I say, not what I do!" And everyone know how valid that kind of advice can be. When we start placing more emphasis on prayer, outreach to the poor, visits to the lonely and forgotten.
