Confirmation Sponsor

Students in the Confirmation Class will be asked to choose a Confirmation Sponsor by Sunday, October 2, 2016. The Catholic Church encourages baptismal godparents to serve as Confirmation sponsors, but it is not required. Sponsors must be at least 16 years old, active and fully initiated Catholics, in good standing. (A fully initiated Catholic is one who has been baptized and confirmed and who has received first communion.) A sponsor may be single or married in the Catholic Church. Parents of the one to be confirmed may not serve as sponsors, but grandparents and siblings may do so. Only one sponsor is required, but two are allowed.

Time Commitment

We understand that high school is a very important and busy time in the lives of our students, and we want to provide the most helpful and beneficial formation experience that we can. To do so, it helps if we can know as much as possible about our students, their interests and activities, and their family lives.
