Dear Friends:

It was an evening I will never forget. I was northbound on Rte. 22. A truck was tailgating me, obviously upset at my slow pace. He could not pass. Finally, I pulled over to stop so he could pass. He passed, then stopped his truck in the middle of the road, got out of the truck, and started yelling obscenities at me. I was scared to death. Finally his girlfriend in the truck said to stop and get in the truck. The man was very "out of control." Anger had taken him over.

Every day we read events where a person is arrested for being overtaken by anger. Sometimes fueled by alcohol or drugs, these poor souls lose control and commit acts of violence against innocent people.

There is, admittedly, something we call "constructive anger." This is when someone uses positive emotional arguments to make important changes in certain situations. This happens all the time in our world.

But this is not what we are talking about. We are talking about destructive anger. This anger can destroy jobs, families, relationships and lives. It is something that must be dealt with, and somehow conquered. There is no question that this kind of anger sometimes is more harmful to the angry person than to others.

One of the lessons I've learned in life is that it is useless to be angry about something you cannot change. Millions of people walk around angry about things that they cannot control. Do you want to live your life as a miserable, grumbling, aggressive figure? I hope not. It's healthy for everyone to just let the anger go.
