Dear Friends!

This week we are privileged to welcome Monsignor Eggert to our parish!

He is such an amazing priest. He was my pastor and the first priest I was ever assigned to work with; he has taught me so much, and he helped me as much as anyone in my own journey towards the priesthood. Please thank him for coming and give him a warm welcome.

On Sunday, Nov. 1st, I am away down in Roswell for the final profession of Sr. María José, a Poor Clare nun of the monastery of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

I have a very excellent relationship with that particular community and they had invited me many months ago to be there for the final profession, to join with their bishop and the parents of Sr. María José who are coming all the way from Spain. I felt and was so honored by that request, how could I say no?

A "final profession" is to a nun as an ordination is to a priest. It's a very big deal, and there is perhaps no ceremony or occasion in the whole Church more beautiful than a nun's final profession.

We owe a lot to the monastery in Roswell. They are one of our parish's greatest resources.

They are totally cloistered there so, once you enter, that's it! You never leave the monastery. They pray all day and they wake up in the middle of the night to pray during the night. They have the most beautiful and angelic singing; Mass there is truly one of the most heavenly experiences you could possibly have.

They are so good, they are attracting young vocations and literally from all over the world to come there. It is a whole community of 24 young, vibrant and wonderful sisters. They are incredible and because they are so solid and faithful, they are thriving.

If you are a young lady and interested in the religious life, please talk to me!

Every day our nuns in Roswell are praying for us and the whole Church and calling down all the graces we need.

I am absolutely convinced that all of the awesome things happening in our parish are in large part the result of the prayers of that community of Poor Clares in Roswell together with our Carmelites in Santa Fe.

So please repay something of their goodness to us. Pray for our nuns. Pray for vocations to the religious life. Pray for Sr. María José. Support and pray for our Poor Clares in Roswell.

Pray for them and know that they are already praying fervently for us--and trust me no matter what we could ever do for them, we are getting the better end of this deal.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark


