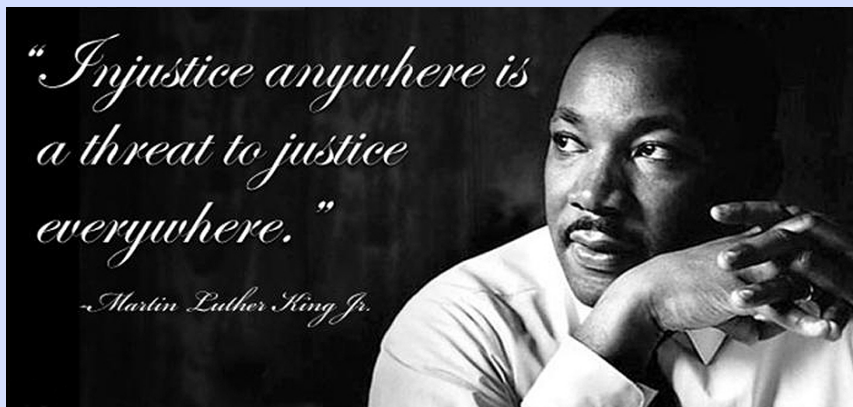

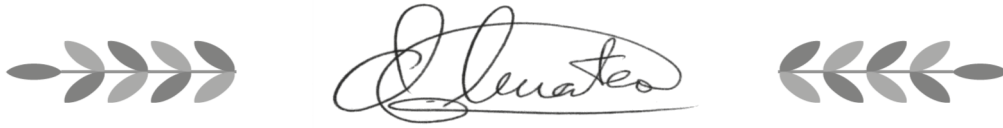

## WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR



Near Nazareth a great spiritual renewal was in progress. St. John the Baptist, a humble man, was preaching repentance to his followers because the long awaited Messiah was coming. Many gathered to hear what he had to say and many were baptized in the Jordan River.

One day Jesus appeared at the river and presented Himself for baptism. He waited His turn and was baptized by John. The scenario is hard for us to understand: Jesus standing in line? Jesus, the Lord of life being baptized with sinners? Jesus being baptized by John?

His baptism represents and expresses His "yes" as He freely accepts the work of salvation given to Him by the Father. He was also declaring that He was the Son of God. Jesus is like us in all things but sin. He had identified Himself with those He had come to serve and save. He never set Himself apart from our human condition. His mission began that day at the Jordan River and will conclude on Mount Calvary.

Through His baptism Jesus identified Himself with our humanity. Through our own baptism we identify ourselves with Him. Our baptism is the beginning of "a process of conversion" that lasts a lifetime. It is a daily experience of transformation that leads from my will, my way and my convenience to doing God's will in His time and His way, responding to His love.

Being anointed with the Holy Spirit and having His power, we too are to go about doing good works and healing all who are in need. We use the power given us by the Spirit to bring peace, forgiveness, love and justice to our tired and troubled world. We are to be a light that shatters the darkness of selfishness, dishonesty and sin. We are to open the eyes of those who are blinded by doubt, confusion and despair. We are to comfort those who are bruised by the worries and cares of every day life. We are to help those held captive by their poverty, their lack of food or employment. Yes, you and I are called to change by our care, concern and love for our neighbor.

We must never forget that we are God's chosen ones, the favored sons and daughters whom He has called to a baptism of repentance. The biblical meaning of that word "repentance" is not beating up on ourselves for all our past mistakes and sinfulness but has the notion of seeing something new, a whole new way of living. It is doing something different than what we are presently doing.

Un día, Jesús apareció a ese río y se presentó a sí mismo para el bautismo. Él esperó su turno y fue bautizado por Juan. El escenario es difícil para nosotros entender: ¿Jesús parado en la fila? Jesús, el Señor de la vida siendo bautizado con pecadores? Jesús siendo bautizado por Juan?

Su bautismo representa y expresa su "sí" al aceptar libremente la obra de salvación que le ha dado el Padre. Él también estaba declarando que Él era el Hijo de Dios. Jesús es como nosotros en todo excepto en el pecado. Se identificó con aquellos a quienes había venido a servir y a salvar. Él nunca se apartó de nuestra condición humana. Su misión comenzó ese día en el río Jordán y concluirá en el Monte Calvario.

A través de Su bautismo, Jesús se identificó a Sí mismo con nuestra humanidad. A través de nuestro propio bautismo, nos identificamos con él. Nuestro bautismo es el comienzo de "un proceso de conversión" que dura toda la vida. Es una experiencia diaria de transformación que deriva de mi voluntad, mi manera y a mi conveniencia de hacer la voluntad de Dios en Su tiempo y Su camino, respondiendo a Su amor.

Al ser ungidos con el Espíritu Santo y tener Su poder, nosotros también debemos hacer buenas obras y sanar a todos los que lo necesiten. Usamos el poder que nos ha dado el Espíritu para traer paz, perdón, amor y justicia a nuestro mundo cansado y atribulado. Debemos ser una luz que rompa la oscuridad del egoísmo, la deshonestidad y el pecado. Debemos abrir los ojos de aquellos que están cegados por la duda, la confusión y la desesperación. Debemos consolar a aquellos que están heridos por las preocupaciones y preocupaciones de la vida cotidiana. Debemos ayudar a los cautivos por su pobreza, su falta de alimentos o empleo. Sí, usted y yo estamos llamados a cambiar con nuestro cuidado, preocupación y amor por nuestro prójimo.

Nunca debemos olvidar que somos los elegidos de Dios, los hijos e hijas favorecidos a quienes Él ha llamado a un bautismo de arrepentimiento. El significado bíblico de la palabra "arrepentimiento" no nos está golpeando a nosotros mismos por todos nuestros errores pasados y pecaminosidad, sino que tiene la noción de ver algo nuevo, una forma de vida completamente nueva. Está haciendo algo diferente de lo que estamos haciendo actualmente.

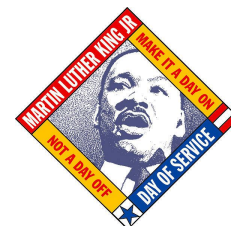

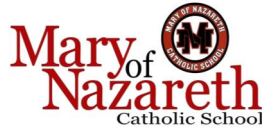

**QUESTION:** What does it mean in the Our Father when we ask the Lord to "Lead us not into temptation?" Why would God tempt us to sin?

**ANSWER:** Although I received this question several months ago, it is very timely given the fact that Pope Francis has recently made some comments regarding the translation of the Our Father into modern languages. Specifically, the pope was asked a question about a recent French translation of the Our Father which altered these words.

The Lord's prayer can be found in two places within the New Testament: Matthew 6:9-13 and Luke 11:2-4. Translations of scriptural texts usually take Greek as their base language. (If you want to take a look, a current Greek critical edition of the New Testament can be found under the name Nestle-Aland.) The process of translation is typically more than simply a word-for-word substitution of one language for another. Instead, translation often involves converting overall concepts rather than individual words. Translating from one language to another almost always causes problems and this situation is no exception. While "lead us not into temptation" is a rather faithful literal translation, it does not precisely convey the meaning of Jesus's words.

Anyone who raises their eyebrows as the request "lead us not into temptation" possesses good theological instincts. It is certainly the case that God cannot tempt a person to commit evil because the act of tempting someone is itself an act of evil. God cannot commit evil because it would contradict His nature. However, we know that our Father in heaven, who loves us, does allow us to experience evil. We refer to this phenomenon of God allowing evil as his permissive will. God permits evil, but he never causes evil. (Why this is will be the subject for another article.)

Given this understanding of God's relationship to temptation, we can see the intended meaning of this penultimate petition of the Lord's prayer. We are asking God to not allow us to experience the time of trial. There are many gifts that God wants to give to us, but he wants us to ask for them so that we know from where they come.
