WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR

Isn't true that, "There is none as blind as those who chose not to see?" All of us close our eyes to things that do not please us. We turn the other way. We go on our way avoiding the problems or issues that make us feel uncomfortable. In our short sightedness, we stumble along with a blindness that comes from being unwilling to face reality.

Today's readings speak about seeing things as they really are. Samuel is blind to David because of his youth and inexperience. He does not see as God sees. The Lord always looks into the heart, not just at the outward appearance or action of any individual. St. Paul speaks of darkness covering the people and their need to live by the light of faith. The Pharisees in their blindness refused to recognize Jesus for who He was and ignored what He had to say. It was the blind man who was able to see and recognize Jesus as the Lord.

But there is more to this miracle. Not only is the blind man cured of his blindness, but he gradually grows in his faith and becomes more and more aware of Jesus. The blind man says, "I do believe," and then he bowed down to worship Him. This transition from darkness to light, from unbelief to faith, is something all of us experience on our journey through life. All of us are blind in one way or another. We are shortsighted and lack the faith and trust necessary for living out Jesus' ideals.

As Christians we care for one another, and yet many people around us are starving - not only for food, but for attention, support and real love. Sometimes this even happens in our own families. We are blinded by our own desire to satisfy our many wants. We are always looking for more.

It seems as though the way to happiness is a large income, a good paying job, a new home, a new car and a lot of things, but isn't it strange that most of the happy people we know don't have very much? In their simple lifestyles, they still have time to share what little they have with those who are less fortunate. They are the grateful ones who see life as a gift.

It seems as though we love our children and our family gatherings, but there are more divorces, more separations and more single parent families. And sad to say, there are more abused, neglected and poorly educated children, and we just don't understand our teenagers these days.

It seems as though we are a deeply religious people, but our Churches are not full. There are fewer people interested in ministry as lay volunteers, priests, brothers and sisters. Many are so busy that they cannot fit God into their hectic schedules. There is less and less time for prayer and reflection. Things are not what they seem to be.

What are we to do? The Lord can open our eyes if we let Him. We are called to abandon that old blindness we hang on to, "to wipe clean the sins of our souls", to expand our vision beyond what seems to be.

We are to get a life, become real, and strive with all our hearts to be God's insightful, beautiful people.

¿No es verdad que, "No hay nadie tan ciego como aquellos que eligieron no ver?" Todos nosotros cerramos los ojos a cosas que no nos agradan. Nos volvemos hacia otro lado. Seguimos nuestro camino evitando los problemas o problemas que nos hacen sentir incómodos. En nuestra corta visión, tropezamos con una ceguera que proviene de no estar dispuestos a enfrentar la realidad.

Las lecturas de hoy hablan de ver las cosas como realmente son. Samuel está ciego a David por su juventud e inexperience. Él no ve lo que Dios ve. El Señor siempre mira al corazón, no solo a la apariencia o acción externa de cualquier individuo. San Pablo habla de las tinieblas que cubren a las personas y su necesidad de vivir a la luz de la fe. Los fariseos en su ceguera se negaron a reconocer a Jesús por lo que él era, y ignoraron lo que tenía que decir. Fue el ciego que pudo ver y reconocer a Jesús como el Señor.

Pero hay más en este milagro. El ciego no solo se cura de su ceguera, sino que gradualmente crece en su fe y se vuelve más y más consciente de Jesús. El ciego dice: "Yo sí creo", y luego se inclinó para adorarlo. Esta transición de la oscuridad a la luz, de la incredulidad a la fe, es algo que todos nosotros experimentamos en nuestro viaje por la vida. Todos estamos ciegos de una manera u otra. Somos miopes y carecen de la fe y la confianza necesarias para vivir los ideales de Jesús.

Aunque los cristianos nos importamos unos a otros y, sin embargo, muchas personas a nuestro alrededor están muriendo de hambre no solo por comida, sino por atención, apoyo y amor verdadero. Algunas veces esto incluso ocurre en nuestras propias familias. Estamos cegados por nuestro propio deseo de satisfacer nuestros muchos deseos. Siempre estamos buscando más.

Parece que el camino a la felicidad es un gran ingreso, un trabajo bien pagado, un nuevo hogar, un automóvil nuevo y muchas cosas, pero ¿no es extraño que la mayoría de las personas felices que conocemos no tengan mucho? En sus sencillos estilos de vida, todavía tienen tiempo para compartir lo poco que tienen con los menos afortunados. Son los agradecidos que ven la vida como un regalo.

Parece que amamos a nuestros hijos y a nuestras reuniones familiares, pero hay más divorcios, más separaciones y más familias de un solo padre o madre. Y es triste decir que hay más niños maltratados, abandonados y con poca educación, y no entendemos a nuestros adolescentes en estos días.

Parece que somos personas profundamente religiosas, pero nuestras iglesias no están llenas. Hay menos personas interesadas en el ministerio como voluntarios laicos, sacerdotes, hermanos y hermanas. Muchos están tan ocupados que no pueden adaptarse a Dios en sus horarios agitados. Hay cada vez menos tiempo para la oración y la reflexión. Las cosas no son lo que parecen ser.

¿Qué vamos a hacer? El Señor puede abrir nuestros ojos si lo dejamos. Estamos llamados a abandonar esa vieja ceguera a la que nos aferramos, "para limpiar los pecados de nuestras almas", para expandir nuestra visión más allá de lo que parece ser.

Debemos obtener una vida, ser real y esforzarnos con todos nuestros corazones para ser la gente hermosa e intuitiva de Dios.

QUESTION: What does it mean to say that someone is "canonized a saint"?

ANSWER: We often hear mention that a particular figure who was known for having lead a holy life has been "beatified" or has been "canonized" a saint. One can easily wonder what is occurring here – how can the Church "turn someone into" a saint? Certainly, the Church does not have the power to change the state of a person's soul after death. (*Caveat:* We do believe that our prayers for the dead help them in some way.) Therefore, something else must be at work.

The process of becoming a saint starts on a local level, with the bishop of the diocese opening the "Cause for sainthood" with the permission of the Holy See (colloquially known as 'the Vatican'). Once the Cause has been opened and the Church begins examining the life of the person in question, they are known as a **Servant of God**. As evidence is collected and examined by the appropriate people, the nature of a person's character begins to make itself seen. If the person lead a life of "heroic virtue," they become known as **Venerable**. At this point it becomes common for people on the local level to print up little cards or booklets to give out in order to "promote the cause" of this Venerable person.

As people begin to pray to the Venerable, asking his or her intercession in obtaining God's grace with regards to various needs, sometimes these prayers are answered. If such prayers are answered in a way whereby a miracle (typically an unexplainable medical cure) occurs, the events and facts surrounding the miracle are carefully documented and sent to various experts for evaluation. After sufficient examination, if it is concluded that a miracle has occurred, then the person is "beatified" and thus becomes known as **Blessed**. At this point, it is understood that the person is in heaven and from that vantage point has been able to obtain the miracle on behalf of the person praying for it. Additionally, the Blessed is now honored – e.g., by having their feast day celebrated at Mass – on a local, diocesan level.

If an additional miracle occurs, then the person is "canonized" and becomes known as a **Saint**. At this point the Saint's feast day is added to the "universal calendar" and they are honored throughout the world. Thus, in canonizing a person, the Church doing nothing other than recognizing the reality that this holy person is now in heaven.
