WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR

Today's reading from the Book of Wisdom describes the world as it came fresh from the hand of the Creator. It says, "God did not make death, He fashioned all things that they might have being and the creatures of the world are wholesome. God formed man to be imperishable." It shows us creation filled with the life of God. It is the natural world in all its beauty.

Then something snapped. "But by the envy of the devil, death entered the world," says the Book of Wisdom. This refers to that split from God that ruptured creation in the Original Sin. It is as though God had created a magnificent and splendid glass window. Everything fits together and suddenly it was shattered. We can pick up each of the pieces of glass and see a little of the beauty of the original creation still there.

We know the awesome power we all have to transmit life; the capacity of the human being to make choices that can shape his or her life; the power of fidelity to remain loyal to our promises for a lifetime; the birth and growth of children; the capacity of the human mind to discover, to invent, to imagine as in the mapping of human DNA; the drive and ambition of a person to improve a community, to shape the world, build a city, go to the moon, help someone make it in life...

These are all magnificent pieces of God's original creation but each of these pieces broken from the rest has a jagged edge, and it can harm us. We know how sexuality, when separated from its purpose in marriage, can dominate a person's life. We know how ambition can trample on people and nations. We know how indulgence in drugs and drink can destroy a life, a family and a society. We know how human beings, by the evil they do, can turn a city into a war zone, how technology can serve sinister purposes like the temptations of the Internet. In each of these cases, the power of the original creation is still there, but it is broken off from its center. The inner harmony, the coherence, the link to God that held everything together were lost by Original Sin.

Jesus came to put the broken pieces together into a new creation. We see that in today's Gospel. Jesus restores a small girl to her family and heals a woman with that "flow of blood." By that healing, the Lord not only cures her illness but also restores her to her community. Throughout the Gospels we see Jesus through His teaching, His miracles and now through His Church and the Holy Spirit putting together the broken pieces.

Do all the pieces fit together in our life? Or do we cut ourselves on those jagged edges? Are we willing to settle for a broken world? Or do we know and trust that repair and healing can take place in our lives and between people? The thrust of the Gospels is that we don't have to settle for broken pieces or broken lives. Jesus can help us put the

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La lectura de hoy del Libro de la Sabiduría describe el mundo tal como vino fresco de la mano del Creador. Dice: "Dios no hizo la muerte, Él creó todas las cosas que podrían tener y las criaturas del mundo son sanas. Dios formó al hombre para que fuera imperecedero." Nos muestra la creación llena de la vida de Dios. Es el mundo natural en toda su belleza.

Entonces algo se rompió. "Pero por la envidia del diablo, la muerte entró en el mundo", dice el Libro de la Sabiduría. Esto se refiere a esa división de Dios que rompió la creación en el Pecado Original. Es como si Dios hubiera creado una magnífica y espléndida ventana de vidrio. Todo encaja y de repente se hizo añicos. Podemos recoger cada una de las piezas de vidrio y ver un poco de la belleza de la creación original que aún existe.

Conocemos el asombroso poder que todos tenemos para transmitir la vida; la capacidad del ser humano para tomar decisiones que pueden moldear su vida; el poder de la fidelidad para permanecer fieles a nuestras promesas de por vida; el nacimiento y crecimiento de los niños; la capacidad de la mente humana para descubrir, inventar, imaginar, como en el mapeo del ADN humano; el impulso y la ambición de una persona para mejorar una comunidad, para dar forma al mundo, construir una ciudad, ir a la luna, ayudar a alguien a triunfar en la vida...

Estas son piezas magníficas de la creación original de Dios, pero cada una de estas piezas rotas del resto tiene un borde irregular, y puede dañarnos. Sabemos cómo la sexualidad, cuando se separa de su propósito en el matrimonio, puede dominar la vida de una persona. Sabemos cómo la ambición puede pisotear a las personas y las naciones. Sabemos cómo la indulgencia con las drogas y la bebida puede destruir una vida, una familia y una sociedad. Sabemos cómo los seres humanos mediante el mal que hacen pueden convertir una ciudad en una zona de guerra, cómo la tecnología puede servir a fines siniestros, como las tentaciones de Internet. En cada uno de estos casos, el poder de la creación original todavía está allí, pero está separado de su centro. La armonía interna, la coherencia, el vínculo con Dios que mantenía todo junto se perdieron por el pecado original.

Jesús vino a unir las piezas rotas en una nueva creación. Vemos eso en el Evangelio de hoy. Jesús restaura a una niña pequeña a su familia y sana a una mujer con ese "flujo de sangre". Al sanar, el Señor no solo cura su enfermedad sino que también la restaura a su comunidad. A lo largo de los Evangelios, vemos a Jesús a través de Su enseñanza, Sus milagros y ahora a través de Su Iglesia y del Espíritu Santo que reúne los pedazos rotos.

¿Todas las piezas encajan juntas en nuestra vida? ¿O nos cortamos en esos bordes dentados? ¿Estamos dispuestos a conformarnos con un mundo roto? ¿O sabemos y confiamos en que la reparación y la curación pueden tener lugar en nuestras vidas y entre las personas? El objetivo de los Evangelios es que no tenemos que conformarnos con pedazos rotos o vidas rotas. Jesús puede ayudarnos a unir las piezas rotas, en nuestras vidas y luego en nuestro mundo. Pero primero, tenemos que acercarnos a Él, acercarnos a Él y venir a Él. Muy a menudo, buscamos

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broken pieces together, in our lives and then in our world. But first, we have to reach out to Him, go to Him, and come to Him. So often, we look to mend our lives in externals - a new neighborhood, a new job, new clothes, a new therapist - when we really need healing and mending on the inside. Jesus gives us that deeper healing. He is a wonderful and wise physician, always on call.

We can still see pieces of that first creation in our lives in the desire for justice, the yearning for peace, the search for perfect love or faithful friendship, but we never quite find it in this world. All of these are signs of that first creation that can be repaired in Christ's new creation.

Jesus can bring healing into our life. That is why the Church remembers and proclaims His miracles to us today. Jesus can give us that peace St. Augustine once described as the "tranquillity of order." Peace is the tranquillity of order for a nation and for an individual soul. Peace is the tranquillity of order, everything in its proper place, doing what it was intended to do, the broken pieces put back together.

Every Sacrament and every Mass is a reminder that Christ can put all the broken pieces back together again in you, me and others. In Him, we can know "the tranquillity of order."

Jesús puede darnos esa paz que San Agustín una vez describió como la "tranquilidad del orden". La paz es la tranquilidad del orden para una nación y para un alma individual. La paz es la tranquilidad del orden, todo en su lugar, haciendo lo que se pretendía hacer, las piezas rotas puestas juntas.

Cada Sacramento y cada Misa es un recordatorio de que Cristo puede volver a unir todas las piezas rotas en usted, en mí y en los demás. En Él, podemos conocer "la tranquilidad del orden".
