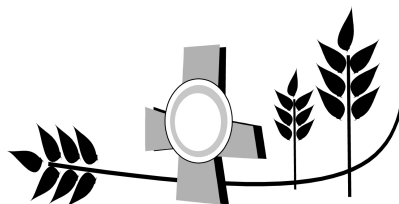

WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR

We may sometimes ask ourselves: "What do I want out of life?" The answer to this question is very, very important.

- If we are starving for food, surely we will answer that we want food.
- If we are prisoners and being tortured, surely we will answer that we want freedom.
- If we feel lonely, abandoned or betrayed, surely we will answer that we want true love and/or friendship.

So often our answers can be a clear response to the things that we most lack in life.

In many countries and among many peoples, there are enormous lacks of those material goods that make life livable. But even in countries and among people who seem to have most everything, there are needs.

Perhaps it is when we have most things that we can ask ourselves: "What do I want out of life?" If I already have enough food, do I want more? If I have freedom, can I have even more freedom? Do I want a bigger and better home and more money? What do I want?

Today's first reading speaks about our ancestors in the faith. They wanted freedom. They were willing to leave Egypt for freedom. But as soon as they had freedom, they realized that they now lacked the food that they had enjoyed in Egypt! This is such a human story. When we get what we want, then we want something else. And very often we forget to enjoy what we have already.

In our Gospel, people begin to follow Jesus and He realizes that they are following Him because He was able to give them bread. They do not recognize that when He gave them bread, there was a great sign being presented about God's relationship to the world.

Today's readings challenge us to consider our own lives, what we have, what we lack and what we want.

- Am I seriously hungry for spiritual food?
- Do I confuse the goods of this life with serious spiritual food?
- Am I willing to give up my life in order to receive bread from heaven?
- Am I willing to suffer in this life for the sake of true spiritual food?
- Am I willing to accept whatever happens in my life and seek God alone?

May this Sunday open our hearts and our minds to the divine presence. May we desire God's presence with our whole being and do whatever is necessary to seek God's mercy and compassion!

A veces podemos preguntarnos: "¿Qué quiero de la vida?" La respuesta a esta pregunta es muy, muy importante.

- Si estamos muriendo de hambre, seguramente responderemos que queremos comida.
- Si estamos prisioneros y somos torturados, seguramente responderemos que queremos libertad.
- Si nos sentimos solos, abandonados o traicionados, seguramente responderemos que queremos amor verdadero y / o amistad.

Muy a menudo, nuestras respuestas pueden ser una respuesta clara a las cosas que más nos faltan en la vida.

En muchos países y entre muchos pueblos, hay enormes carencias de esos bienes materiales que hacen que la vida sea habitable. Pero incluso en países y entre personas que parecen tener más de todo, hay necesidades.

Quizás es cuando tenemos la mayoría de las cosas que podemos preguntarnos: "¿Qué quiero de la vida?" Si ya tengo suficiente comida, ¿quiero más? Si tengo libertad, ¿puedo tener aún más libertad? ¿Quiero un hogar más grande y mejor y más dinero? ¿Qué quiero?

La primera lectura de hoy habla sobre nuestros antepasados en la fe. Ellos querían libertad. Estaban dispuestos a dejar Egipto por la libertad. ¡Pero tan pronto como tuvieron libertad, se dieron cuenta de que ahora carecían de la comida que habían disfrutado en Egipto! Esta es una historia humana. Cuando obtenemos lo que queremos, entonces queremos algo más. Y muchas veces nos olvidamos de disfrutar lo que ya tenemos.

En nuestro Evangelio, la gente comienza a seguir a Jesús y se da cuenta de que lo están siguiendo porque pudo darles pan. No reconocen que cuando les dio pan, se presentó un gran signo acerca de la relación de Dios con el mundo.

Las lecturas de hoy nos desafían a considerar nuestras propias vidas, lo que tenemos, lo que nos falta y lo que queremos.

- ¿Estoy realmente hambriento de comida espiritual?
- ¿Confundo los bienes de esta vida con comida espiritual sería?
- ¿Estoy dispuesto a renunciar a mi vida para recibir pan del cielo?
- ¿Estoy dispuesto a sufrir en esta vida por la verdadera comida espiritual?
- ¿Estoy dispuesto a aceptar todo lo que pase en mi vida y buscar solo a Dios?

Que este domingo abra nuestros corazones y nuestras mentes a la presencia divina. ¡Que deseemos la presencia de Dios con todo nuestro ser y hagamos lo que sea necesario para buscar la misericordia y la compasión de Dios!

This week, a parishioner asked me, "What is the significance of the Second Vatican Council for our parish?"

I could write an encyclopedia explaining how St. Rose of Lima Parish is a reflection of the Second Vatican Council. I will comment on one little detail in our parish that reflects the motherly, tender love of the Church for us, her children.

When I first arrived at the parish, I not only saw the baptismal pool to pour water on babies and young children, but also the baptismal pool for full immersion of adults. I was delighted to see this, since during the first centuries of the Church, the Church Fathers prepared people for baptism through a long period called the "Catechumenate." At the end of this period, adults were baptized by being fully immersed in the waters of baptism. This catechumenal preparation for baptism sort of faded away in the first millennium. Today, there are many adults who are not baptized. The Church wants to bring her adult children into the Catholic faith, just as she did in her early beginnings. For this reason, the Church gathered many of her pastors for the Second Vatican Council from 1962 to 1965. At this meeting, the Church recovered, among many other teachings, the practice of the catechumenate, and consequently, the baptism by immersion for adults who have never been baptized. This is how we today have the catechumenate for those who seek baptism as adults. Many parishes built after the Second Vatican Council have the richness of the baptismal pool for adults, as in the early Church. Our St. Rose parish is one of these parishes built reflecting the treasures of the Second Vatican Council.

I hope this reflection can help parishioners to appreciate the treasures of teaching and grace that we have for everyone in our parish. If this reflection left you curious for more, do not hesitate to invite me for a cup of coffee and we can talk more. I will be delighted!

WHAT'S THE BIG DEAL ABOUT BEING A REGISTERED MEMBER?

Did you know that demographic studies estimate that more than 1/3 of all Catholics are not registered in a



parish? If you are not registered in our parish, please consider doing so! Encourage your family and friends to register! (Especially encourage your adult children who were formerly registered in your family household to register as adults with their own membership record.)

Registering is important because:

- If a parish doesn't know who is out there, how can it adequately serve the needs of all – especially singles, divorced or young families who may not see the need to register?
- When the services of the Church are needed - such as for a wedding, Baptism or funeral - it is easier if the person is registered.
- Registered parishioners receive helpful information about our parish—i.e. the notification about Game Preserve Road being closed.

How do you know if you are registered? Registered members receive offertory envelopes in the mail every two months. If you are not receiving these envelopes, you are likely not listed in our database as registered. If in doubt, call the parish office to verify your membership.

To register, please attend a Newcomer's Orientation, held on the second Sunday of each month. The next Newcomer's Orientation is next Sunday, August 12. The session in Spanish begins promptly at 12:00pm. The session in English begins at 12:15pm.
