WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR

It's easy to get locked into one way of looking at life. There seems to be a pattern to follow and everyone is expected to go through the same routine. We have our rules and rituals to be observed. There is the right way and the wrong way, and we are expected to do it right. Now, if you follow all these rules and regulations, you will be successful. All this is sometimes referred to as conventional wisdom. But Jesus has a better idea about life. He tells us that we are unique, individual, and special, with gifts and talents that make us one of a kind. God has made us that way. Jesus would have us become that beautiful person God has called us to be.

The Scribes and Pharisees, experts in the law, failed to understand that important truth. We hear them ask: "How is it that your disciples do not wash their hands? Why don't they follow the rules and regulations set down by the church?" How can they be members of that church when they ignore those all-important laws, rules and regulations? The Lord had a lot to say about that kind of religious thinking. True religion is not defined by following rules or saying one thing and doing another. To be clean or unclean is not a matter of hands, but rather a matter of the heart.

Since we have been enlightened by Baptism, we must not allow ourselves to have an obtuse spirit, opposition to all that Jesus would expect us to have or to be. An obtuse spirit is really an arrogant spirit, "a know-it-all personality." It goes like this: If I fulfill all those rules and regulations, all those Sunday rituals, then I have satisfied my obligation to God and God now has to do His part. If I keep the law and you do not; then that is great for me, but too bad for you. After all, if I follow the rules and regulations, God can't expect any more from me. I have done my part...

Don't you find it interesting how a religion of laws has all the answers to the mystery of life and can easily explain away any problem, difficulty and suffering? We know deep in our hearts that life is just not that way. Our God is a God of love and His love shines on the unjust as well as the just. We know that God has no favorites. His love is freely given to all and it is to be freely received by all. How senseless it is to think that we can earn His love by obeying rules and regulations. We are not in business with God. To receive His love is to live in His love. The only response that we can make is to love in return.

St. James tells us in the second reading: "We are to humbly welcome the Word that has taken root in us." We just don't listen to that Word. We ponder and reflect upon it and then act on that Word at every opportunity we have. The God who has created us in His image sees into our hearts and finds the good that is there. The Lord who redeemed us with His blood looks into our hearts and finds His own life reflected there. The Spirit who dwells within our hearts gathers us around this table this day to nourish us and send us forth to live out the Good News we have received.

Es fácil encerrarse en una sola forma de ver la vida. Parece que hay un patrón a seguir y se espera que todos pasen por la misma rutina. Tenemos nuestras reglas y rituales para ser observados. Está el camino correcto y el camino equivocado, y se espera que lo hagamos bien. Ahora, si sigue todas estas reglas y regulaciones, tendrá éxito. Todo esto a veces se conoce como sabiduría convencional. Pero Jesús tiene una mejor idea sobre la vida. Él nos dice que somos únicos, individuales y especiales, con dones y talentos que nos hacen únicos. Dios nos ha hecho de esa manera. Jesús quiere que lleguemos a ser la persona hermosa que Dios nos ha llamado a ser.

Los escribas y fariseos, expertos en la ley, no entendieron esa verdad importante. Los escuchamos preguntar: "¿Cómo es que tus discípulos no se lavan las manos? ¿Por qué no siguen las reglas y regulaciones establecidas por la iglesia?"¿Cómo pueden ser miembros de esa iglesia cuando ignoran todas las leyes importantes, reglas y regulaciones? El Señor tenía mucho que decir acerca de ese tipo de pensamiento religioso. La verdadera religión no se define siguiendo las reglas o diciendo una cosa y haciendo otra. Estar limpio o sucio no es una cuestión de manos sino más bien una cuestión del corazón.

Como hemos sido iluminados por el Bautismo, no debemos permitirnos tener un espíritu obtuso, oposición a todo lo que Jesús esperaría que tuviéramos o que fuéramos. Un espíritu obtuso es realmente un espíritu arrogante, "una personalidad entera". Y dice así: si cumplo todas esas reglas y regulaciones, todos esos rituales dominicales, entonces he cumplido mi obligación con Dios y ahora Dios tiene que hacer Su parte Si guardo la ley y tú no; entonces eso es genial para mí, pero es muy malo para ti. Después de todo, si sigo las reglas y regulaciones Dios no puede esperar más de mí. He hecho mi parte...

¿No le parece interesante cómo una religión de leyes tiene todas las respuestas al misterio de la vida y puede explicar fácilmente cualquier problema, dificultad y sufrimiento? Sabemos en lo profundo de nuestros corazones que la vida no es así. Nuestro Dios es un Dios de amor y su amor brilla tanto en los injustos como en los justos. Sabemos que Dios no tiene favoritos. Su amor es dado libremente a todos y debe ser recibido libremente por todos. Qué insensato es pensar que podemos ganar su amor obedeciendo reglas y regulaciones. No estamos en negocios con Dios. Recibir su amor es vivir en su amor. La única respuesta que podemos hacer es amar a cambio.

Santiago nos dice en la segunda lectura: "Debemos acoger humildemente la Palabra que se ha arraigado en nosotros". Simplemente no escuchamos esa Palabra. Reflexionamos sobre eso y luego actuamos en esa Palabra en cada oportunidad que tenemos. El Dios que nos ha creado a su imagen ve en nuestros corazones y encuentra el bien que está allí. El Señor que nos redimió con Su sangre mira a nuestros corazones y encuentra Su propia vida reflejada allí. El Espíritu que mora en nuestros corazones nos reúne alrededor de esta mesa para nutrirnos y enviarnos a vivir las Buenas Nuevas que hemos recibido.

Dear Parishioners,

Many of you have asked me how I ended up in the Archdiocese of Washington, all the way from Paraguay, where I grew up.

I always say that my parents and all my family joined the Neo-Catechumenal Way in Paraguay when I was seven years old. I began to attend the Eucharist on Saturday evenings with them in their communities. When I was fourteen, I began to have my own community, as my family did. I went through the journey of conversion and faith with my community for about five years. The priestly vocations that come out of the Neo-Catechumenal Way are formed with this charism in any "Redemptoris Mater" seminary around the world, since it is a diocesan and missionary seminary. The Archdiocese of Washington has two seminaries: the St. John Paul II seminary and the Redemptoris Mater seminary. This is how I was sent to the Redemptoris Mater in December 2004. I belong to the Archdiocese of Washington, like any other priest of the diocese, with the difference being that I was formed with the charism of the Neo-Catechumenal Way. I can serve in other dioceses of the world if needed. This is roughly the story how I ended up in Washington DC. I am priest number 25 ordained at the Redemptoris Mater. So, there are several other priests just like me in different parishes around the Archdiocese. I have my own Neo-Catechumenal Way here in Washington, where I have journeyed since my arrival in 2004. My community is in St. Bernardette Parish in Silver Spring. It is comprised of several youth, couples, and elders, Hispanics, Anglos, and others. God makes us one in the midst of so much diversity.

May St. Rose of Lima's love for Jesus Christ and his Church burn within you all!
