SCRIPTURE REFLECTION / REFLEXION DE LAS ESCRITURAS

Discerning the Spirit of Prophecy and Cutting Off from Sin

In this Sunday's first reading, we hear Moses discerning the Spirit of God in order to prophesy among the people who walked with him. Similarly, in the gospel there is Jesus, the new Moses, who leads the disciples as the new people of God. Jesus also has to discern together with his disciples the Spirit of prophecy among the people outside of the community of disciples. Jesus proclaims the Kingdom of God with conversion of heart, repentance, exorcising demons, etc. He does all this with the Spirit of God.

But there were other people outside of the community of disciples who were doing similar things as Jesus. So Jesus says "...no one who does a mighty work in my name will be able soon after to speak evil of me". This teaching is closely related to the passage "You will know them by their fruits" (Mt. 7:16). Jesus discerns true from false prophets. An evil prophet cannot bear the fruits of the Kingdom of God. Instead, a true prophet with the Spirit of God will bear the fruits of the Kingdom as Jesus was doing.

One of the fruits of the Kingdom of God is a life of grace, in Christ. For this reason, the second half of the gospel speaks about cutting off from sin in the community of believers. The Spirit of God dwells in the heart of repentant sinners who fight back the seductions of the devil. This struggle to defend the Spirit of God within us from the evil one, from sin, can help us to proclaim the Kingdom of God and to bear good fruits just as Jesus and his disciples did.

We all received this Spirit of prophecy at our baptism after we came out of the baptismal waters. God forgave all our sins and gave us his Spirit to proclaim the Kingdom of God and bear lasting fruits. Let us defend this Spirit within us and speak of the love of God to our neighbor who are like "little ones" waiting for this message of salvation.

Discerniendo el Espíritu de Profecía y Cortando con el Pecado

En la primera lectura de este domingo, escuchamos a Moisés discerniendo el Espíritu de Dios para profetizar en la gente que lo seguía. De una forma parecida, en el evangelio vemos a Jesús, el nuevo Moisés quien guía a los discípulos como el nuevo pueblo de Dios. Jesús también tiene que discernir junto con sus discípulos el espíritu de profecía entre la gente que no estaba dentro de la comunidad de los discípulos. Jesús proclama el Reino de Dios con la conversión de corazón, arrepentimiento, exorcizando demonios, etc. Jesús lleva a cabo esta obra con el Espíritu de Dios.

Pero había otras gentes fuera de la comunidad de los discípulos quienes obraban cosas similares como lo hacía Jesús. Entonces Jesús dice: "...nadie puede hacer un milagro en mi nombre y luego hablar mal de mí". Esta enseñanza está muy relacionada con el pasaje "Ustedes les reconocerán por sus frutos" (Mt. 7:16). Jesús discierne el Espíritu entre los verdaderos y falsos profetas. Un falso profeta no puede producir los frutos del Reino de Dios. En cambio, un verdadero profeta con el Espíritu de Dios producirá los frutos del Reino de Dios como Jesús obraba.

Uno de los frutos del Reino de Dios es la vida en la gracia, en Cristo. Por esta razón, la segunda parte del evangelio habla de cortar con las causas del pecado dentro de la comunidad de los creyentes. El Espíritu de Dios habita en el corazón de los pecadores arrepentidos quienes luchan contra las seducciones del maligno. El Espíritu de Dios habita dentro de nosotros y la batalla por defenderlo del maligno nos ayuda a proclamar el Reino de Dios y a producir buenos frutos así como Jesús y sus discípulos dieron frutos.

Nosotros todos recibimos el Espíritu de profecía en nuestro bautismo después que salimos de las aguas bautismales. Dios perdono todos nuestros pecados y nos dio su Espíritu para proclamar el Reino de Dios y dar frutos que no perecen. Defendamos este Espíritu dentro de nosotros y hablemos del amor de Dios a nuestro vecino quien como los "pequeños" de quienes habla el evangelio está esperando por este mensaje de salvación.

Dear Friends,

Following the short catechesis on the sacrament of reconciliation from last week, I will gradually speak on how to prepare for this sacrament. We all have a conscience within us. St. John Neumann said that "conscience is the voice of God within us." For this reason, a relationship with sacred scripture is fundamental to preparing for a good confession. There are several passages in the gospels where Jesus calls the people and his disciples around him to conversion of heart. The Word of God informs our consciences and leads us towards the sacraments.

There are three main steps in the sacrament of reconciliation. The first step is the examination of conscience. The Word of God is like a flashlight that lights up our lives. It shows when, how, where, and who we hurt with our actions. This examination should bring some sorrow and repentance for our evil deeds. The second step is the actual confession of our sins and evil deeds to a priest. Here, the priest can give us a few words regarding our sins. He will also give us a small penance to do and the absolution from our sins. The third step is to fulfill the penance that the priest gave us. This final third step is called "satisfaction". Next Sunday, I will speak about the type of sins that we may look for within us at the examination of conscience.

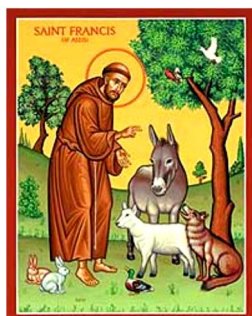

SACRED RELICS OF THE SAINTS: TREASURES OF THE CHURCH

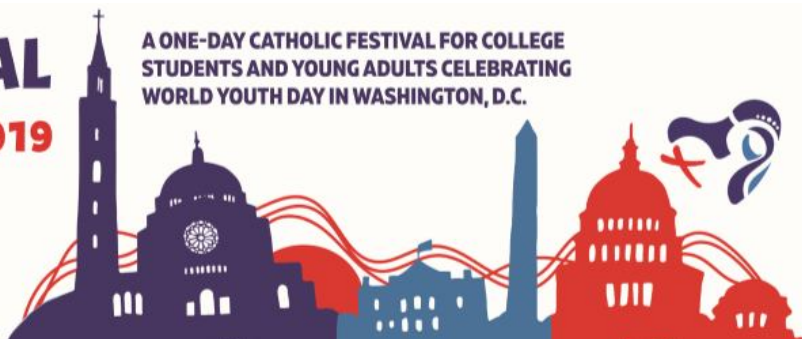

STEWARDSHIP / CORRESPONSABILIDAD

HOW ARE YOUR DONATIONS TO ST. ROSE USED?

We will soon publish our annual Stewardship Report, which provides details about the many good works that are made possible and the many lives impacted through your generous gifts to St. Rose. Here is information about the three main parish funds to which parishioners donate:

Offertory funds are used for our operating budget, providing support for all our programs and ministries (i.e. faith formation for children, youth, and adults; social concerns/outreach ministries; music/liturgical ministries), facilities/maintenance expenses, staff salaries/benefits, and more.

The Offertory fund is subject to assessment by the Archdiocese at a rate of 12%, plus 3% for the Archdiocesan Schools Fund.

Debt Reduction/Mortgage funds are used to pay down the loan debt for the building of our church, completed in 2006.

Capital Campaign funds are for construction of the Gathering Space and to further pay down our loan debt.

Both the Debt Reduction/Mortgage and Capital Campaign funds are exempt from assessment by the Archdiocese.
