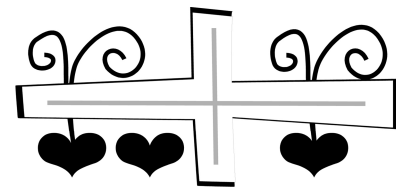

# SCRIPTURE REFLECTION / REFLEXION DE LAS ESCRITURAS

In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus announces three times his passion, death, and resurrection. In chapter 8, Jesus proclaims it. Peter tries to stop him from laying down his life. Jesus tells him, "get behind me Satan, you think as men do, not as God does." In chapter 9, Jesus announces it for the second time. The disciples discuss who is the greatest among themselves, thinking again as men do. And in chapter 10, Jesus announces it for the third time. James and John ask him for the privilege of sitting one at his right and the other at his left in his glory. In the three instances, Jesus announces the plan of salvation of God for all people. But in the three cases, the disciples seem to picture all the worldly mentality in terms of power to conquer the Romans, the prideful honor of being looked at as the greatest, and the privileges for services done.

This Sunday's Gospel is within the context of this third announcement of the passion and resurrection. The disciples once again are thinking as men do in terms of privileges. However, Jesus is immensely merciful and patient with them and teaches them how God thinks and is the best for them. Jesus answers James and John: "Are you able to drink of the chalice that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" At baptism, we become children of God and his disciples. At the Eucharist, we drink of the chalice full of his blood. In both of these sacraments, we are called to think and behave as God does. We give our lives as God's servants to suffer, to be killed, and to rise again with him. This is the way of Christ's disciples. Jesus does not speak to his disciples about privileges, but service to the point of death, martyrdom as a ransom for many. The sacraments give us the power to become the slave of all. This teaching is pretty contrary to the teaching of the world, since the selfish worldly person tries to make everyone else his slave, his servant, for his selfish purposes. The selfish person cannot submit to anyone because it would threaten his selfishness, his privileges, and what he thinks is life. Instead, in the Christian family, the person who is one with Christ through the sacraments becomes the slave of all. This was the answer of the Virgin Mary to the angel, "I am the handmaid of the Lord." Christian parents serve their children day and night with their homework, teaching them the Catholic faith, providing for their needs, protecting them from sinful harms. This is how we can say that Christian parents are called to be the slaves of their children as they serve them, so that they may become children of God. Similarly, brothers and sisters are called to do the same among themselves, the priest for his parishioners, etc. In serving each other, we are serving Christ himself. Jesus never spoke about power, honor, wealth, or privileges in following him. On the contrary, he spoke about passion, death, and resurrection. This is the experience of the disciples. They experience resurrection and joy in the midst of sufferings and death for the sake of Christ.

May we never lose sight of our baptismal call to follow Jesus Christ and to drink of the chalice of martyrdom every Sunday at the Eucharist, so that we can think and behave as God does with us.

En el evangelio de Marcos, Jesús anuncia tres veces su pasión, muerte y resurrección. En el capítulo 8, Jesús lo anuncia por primera vez. Pedro lo reprende para que no sufra y muera. Jesús le dice, "apártate de mí satanás porque tus pensamientos no son los de Dios sino lo de los hombres." En el capítulo 9, Jesús lo anuncia de nuevo por segunda vez. Sus discípulos discutían quien era el mayor entre ellos pensando otra vez como los hombres. Y en el capítulo 10, Jesús lo anuncia por tercera vez. Santiago y Juan le piden sentarse uno a su derecha y otro a su izquierda en su gloria. En los tres capítulos, Jesús anuncia el plan de salvación de Dios para toda la humanidad afligida por el pecado que es de morir por los pecadores. Pero las tres veces, los discípulos nos muestran como piensan los hombres mundanos en el aspecto de poder para conquistar a los romanos, la soberbia del honor por ser el mayor, y los privilegios vanos por los servicios prestados.

El evangelio de este domingo está dentro del contexto de este tercer anuncio de la pasión y resurrección de Jesús Cristo. Los discípulos nos muestran cómo piensan los hombres en el área de privilegios. Pero Jesús es inmensamente paciente y misericordioso con sus discípulos y les explica una y otra vez cual es el plan de Dios y cómo piensa Dios para con sus discípulos. Jesús contesta a Santiago y Juan: 'Podéis beber la copa que yo voy a beber o ser bautizados con el bautismo con que yo voy a ser bautizado?' El bautismo nos da la posibilidad de ser hijos de Dios y sus discípulos. En la eucaristía tomamos del cáliz lleno de la sangre de Cristo. En ambos sacramentos estamos llamados a pensar y actuar como Dios. Damos nuestra vida como siervos de Dios para entrar en el sufrimiento, morir y resucitar con él. Este es el camino de los discípulos de Jesús. Jesús no les habla a sus discípulos de privilegios, sino de servicio hasta el punto de dar la vida, el martirio para la salvación de muchos. Los sacramentos nos dan el poder para hacernos esclavos de todos. Esta enseñanza es muy diferente de la del mundo ya que la persona mundana y egoísta trata de esclavizar a todos para su beneficio egoísta. La persona egoísta no puede someterse a nadie porque es una amenaza a su egoísmo, sus privilegios, y como él piensa de la vida. Pero en la familia cristiana, la persona que es una con Cristo a través de los sacramentos se hace esclava de todos. Esto es lo que dijo María cuando contesto al ángel 'Yo soy la esclava del Señor'. Los verdaderos padres cristianos sirven a sus hijos día y noche ayudándoles a hacer la tarea de la escuela, pasándoles la fe, proveyendo para sus necesidades, protegiéndoles del pecado, etc. Es así que podemos decir que los padres son esclavos de sus hijos ayudándoles a crecer en la fe como hijos de Dios. Así también los hermanos y hermanas están llamados a servirse unos a otros, el presbítero en la iglesia está llamado a servir a los parroquianos, etc. En sirviendo a los demás, estamos sirviendo a Cristo mismo. Jesús nunca hablo de poder, honores, riquezas o privilegios a sus discípulos. Al contrario, les hablo de pasión, muerte y resurrección. Esta es la experiencia de los discípulos. Ellos experimentaron resurrección y alegría en medio de los sufrimientos y muerte por amor a Jesucristo.

Que nunca perdamos de vista nuestra misión bautismal de seguir a Jesucristo y de beber del cáliz del martirio cada domingo en la eucaristía, para que pensemos y vivamos como Dios lo hizo con nosotros.

### HOW ARE YOUR DONATIONS TO ST. ROSE USED?

We will soon publish our annual Stewardship Report, which provides details about the many good works that are made possible and the many lives impacted through your generous gifts to St. Rose. Here is information about the three main parish funds to which parishioners donate:

**Offertory** funds are used for the parish operating budget, providing support for all St. Rose programs and ministries (i.e. faith formation for children, youth, and adults; social concerns and outreach ministries; music and liturgical ministries), facilities and maintenance expenses, staff salaries and benefits, and more. This fund is critical to all that we do.

*The Offertory fund is subject to assessment by the Archdiocese at a rate of 12%, plus 3% for the Archdiocesan Schools Fund.*

**Debt Reduction/Mortgage** funds are used to pay down the loan debt for the building of our church, completed in 2006.

**Capital Campaign** funds are for construction of the Gathering Space and to further pay down our loan debt.

*Both the Debt Reduction/Mortgage and Capital Campaign funds are exempt from assessment by the Archdiocese.*

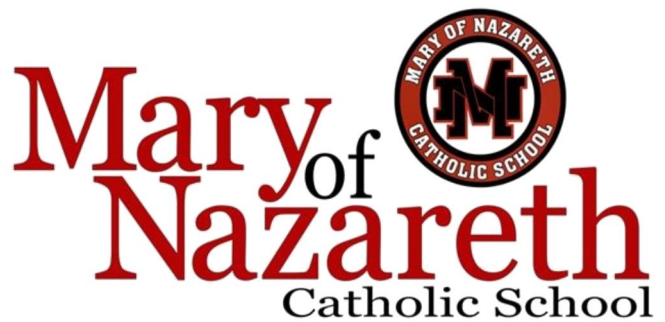

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This week I want to give some hints on how to do a good examination of conscience before approaching the sacrament of confession. The seven deadly sins are a good guide to reflect upon the state of our souls. The seven capital sins are lust, gluttony, greed, sloth, wrath, envy, and pride. The virtues that oppose these vices are chastity, temperance, generosity, diligence, patience, gratitude, and humility. They are called capital sins because they are a little seed for a sin that can become a mortal sin. For instance, a person can be very wrathful and in a moment of extreme wrath can kill someone with his words or physically. The little seed of wrath gave birth to murder. Many people are very hot tempered, but they learn with humility to be patient with oneself and with others. A person can have some moments of wrath, but his virtue of patience can be stronger than his sin. This is how we struggle to walk humbly in the way of virtues and falls into vices. I think we know enough by now about the sacrament of confession. Next week, we can pass on to another sacrament.
