Continuing Adult Education- Apologetics Class

A class in apologetics is used to help answer these types of questions and others about our Catholic faith. Maybe you haven't encountered these questions from others, but maybe you have a family member or friend who has fallen away from the Church and you would like to be better prepared to answer their questions using the Bible, the Catechism, and the oral and written traditions passed down from our Popes and early Church Fathers. Our class is oriented to the topics that the group would like to learn more information about and discuss. So even if you cannot attend every week, the topics can change weekly, so you can come by any time. GOSPEL REFLECTION:

Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29
Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24
Psalm 68:4-7, 10-11
Luke 14:1, 7-14

"For everyone who exalts himself shall be humbled and himself shall be exalted." —Luke 14:11

"Jesus invites us to humble ourselves by taking the lowest place, inviting "beggars and the crippled, the lame and the blind" to follow. Most people take Jesus' words as a suggestion and encourage help the poor. Jesus, however, indicates that His words are to be taken seriously when He concluded His command with the words: "You cannot repay me, for you will be repaid in the resurrection" (Luke 14:14). Jesus' call to humility and service is of ultimate significance.

When Jesus commands us to humble ourselves, it means more than these words coming from anyone else. Jesus washed the feet of His disciples (John 13:4ff) and "humbled Himself, obediently accepting even death" (Phil 2:8) Jesus has humbled Himself by giving Himself to us in such a way that He doesn't look like God or even like a man. In the Eucharist, this crucified, eucharistic God-Man speaks of humility with a depth and love far beyond anything we have ever experienced.
