
CATHOLIC TRIVIA

A reflection by Confirmation student, Robby Ratajczak, during the mission trip to Grenada:

Besiege: To overwhelm. Today on day 3 of our mission trip to Grenada we experienced an overwhelming experience of joy. We split into multiple groups to work on service projects on the island. My group was assigned to painting a local school and church. As soon as we started working we began our interactions with the children in the school. It was smiles from ear to ear as soon as they laid eyes on us. As their lunch time rolled around and they were released to play, the excitement really began. Every kid wanted a "jockey" or piggy back ride, to wrestle or play a game. As I played with these kids I finally understood why God sent me to work here. These children live in poverty and don't know it. They just make the best of what they have and run with it. For my group and me to provide these children with something that excited them so much but was such a simple thing. They enjoyed our presence simply because it was someone new to play with. As I reflect on today I finally understand the fact that it doesn't matter what you have and don't have when you can live the experiences God provides you. Grow from the experience and have an impact on other people's lives and know that it may impact yours more.
