

At the sidewalk of the abortion clinic.....

I know that if you are reading this most likely you are very pro-life. When we stand at the sidewalk of the abortion clinics to talk to the women who are about to walk in there to kill their babies, I know that the reason they stop and talk to us is because they see something in our eyes that tells them that they are not alone. We are a stranger talking to them minutes before they kill their babies. They stop for a few seconds, and they share with us their despair. Unfortunately many still go inside and kill, but some look at us and turn away and save their children. Why?

When we are there at the door of that horrible place, we don't stand alone. First, we bring God to them. They see a sign of God in us, they know God has answered their prayers. Also, when we talk about the reasons for killing their baby and they share that they are living in their car with their children, or that they have no water or electricity and that they are about to be evicted etc... we know you all are behind us to offer them a practical solution that will help them see light. It sounds materialistic, but it is the first step to help the women see their babies as their children and not as an obstacle.

My daughter was diagnosed with Graves Disease on March. I must tell you that these past few months have been so difficult for me watching her be so sick. I didn't sleep a full night since then. Today it is a week since they took her thyroid out and I can finally begin to rest. I had to modify the hours that I could be at the office. She needed constant monitoring, even through the night. Mr. Miller covered for me after school, he gave pregnancy tests, counsel, cleaned, repaid, distributed diapers, food, etc.

This past Wednesday I decided I could go with him for a couple of hours. He brought dear friend teacher from school and a couple of students to help us. We saw 10 mothers in 3 ½ hrs! 8 of them pregnant! All of them turned away from abortion! They picked up diapers, car seats, bassinets, clothes, food, gas cards etc. Some were new mothers we had just met and had to be counsel and since I was running around distributing all these items, Mr. Miller had to do all the counseling. I had to come in and out of our counseling room to grab this or that. I was there at the beginning when he asked the first woman what she thought of her baby and she said it was too late for her now to have an abortion. A few minutes later I walked in to the room again when he asked her what she thought of her baby now and she answered that her baby was as important as any of her other children and that the baby couldn't be destroyed at any point and that abortion was not right.

We all want abortion to end. We want to stop the murders, but while it all happens, we can work with one woman at a time. It is not such a fast solution, but it works. When we have our meetings, we get to see all these children who would have been killed running all over the place, happy and loved!

Please remember that we count on your support. Summer is usually the time where we get the least support, but it is as busy as usual at the sidewalk.

We have to pay moving costs for 4 of our mothers and it is around 1500.00 for each of them. We need diapers sizes 4 and 5 and 6. We need to help some of them with gas to get to hospital visits and work. We need car seats and booster seats and summer clothes. We need to offer what ever it takes to help women snap out of their blindness so that they can see their babies and choose life. Please help us! Do not forget these mothers. Do not forget these children are being saved right before they enter the abortion clinic. We tell the women that you are all there behind us. That you are willing to help them.
