## Armed Forces Honor Garden

In this bulletin, you will find a brochure describing the Armed Forces Honor Garden that will be built at St. Paul's. It will be designed with water fountains emblazoned with memorial stars, memorial plaques and paving stones to honor all those who have served in our Armed Forces over the years, and will include opportunities for parishioners and others to honor and memorialize family and friends who have served our country. Presently, construction estimates are \$160,000. A campaign to gain funds to begin construction is now underway. The first major pledge was made by parishioner Roger Staubach and his wife, Marianne. Staubach attended the U.S. Naval Academy, where he won a Heisman Trophy, and after graduation he served in the U.S. Navy, including a tour of duty in Vietnam, before becoming the quarterback for the Dallas Cowboys.

The statue was donated to St. Paul's by parishioners Gary and Patty Broad. A U.S. Army veteran, Gary was married to his wife Patty, originally from Canada, at St. Paul's in June 2014. When he learned of the statue and that it was created by sculptor Timothy Schmaltz, also from Canada, he considered it a "sign" for him to make a donation of the work. The idea for the memorial honor garden came from Father Patiño, who as a teenager was a member of the American Junior GI Forum in Corpus Christi, Texas. "Among my most poignant memories was being invited to be part of an honor guard to welcome home fallen American soldiers as they arrived at the airport and escort the bodies to their families in the small rural towns of South Texas," Fr. Patiño said. "The Vietnam War was raging, the dead were numerous, and so the GI Forum volunteered to act as honor guard. I remember feeling quite honored to have been invited to join in. I was especially moved by the gratitude of the families whose sons had given their lives for our country," he said. Years later, as a seminary student in Washington, D.C., Fr. Patiño recalled the Honor Guard experience as he walked the path of the Vietnam War Memorial Wall. The thousands of names inscribed on the wall were overwhelming to him, among them the name of his own step-brother, Robert Patiño. Then, last year, he was shown a photo of a statue entitled, 'Lest We Forget,' depicting Jesus Christ embracing a soldier. "I guess we can all find our own meaning to the title of the statue but for me it is about forgiveness and gratitude. Forgiveness because, as Christians, we are taught to respect human life; taking someone's life goes against our Christian beliefs. We can reconcile the issue from a theological perspective but the human dimension is another story. Somehow, we need to find peace with our lives and with our compromises; this has been a concern for all veterans of war. The statue evokes a feeling of gratitude. I believe those who have served our country loyally need to know that, as a country, we appreciate their valor and their service."

Our campaign has begun and we appreciate those who have pledged and those who will pledge to help the parish make this a reality.
