THE SCRIPTURE- September 3, 2017**Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Times**

When God chose Jeremiah as a prophet to speak to his people Israel it was not to tell Israel what they would like to hear or what would gladden their hearts, but what they ought to hear that will make them come back to God. When Jeremiah therefore spoke, it was more of violence and destruction. This made the people to deride Jeremiah. Jeremiah got frustrated and would have loved to abandon the prophetic work but God's words cannot be suppressed. So, Jeremiah continued despite the persecution.

As Christians, we all share in the prophetic mission of Jesus. How do we live out our prophetic role in the family, in the church, and in the society where we find ourselves? Do we tell our children what they ought to hear that will help them turn to God and to be better people in the society? Or do we tell them what they want to hear because we wouldn't want to hurt their feelings? Do we encourage our religious and political leaders to tell us what we ought to hear that will help us to be good people even if it hurts our feelings? When we do these things, we will be derided like Jeremiah but as Jesus said, "what will it profit a man, if he gains the whole world and forfeits his life?" We must indeed deny ourselves and take up our crosses and follow Jesus if we would want to be his disciples.

Speaking out prophetically in this manner with all the persecutions that follow it is part of what it means to be Jesus's disciples. May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our hearts that we might know what is the hope to which he has called us.

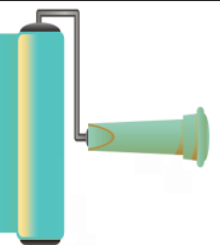
