Priest Convocation

This week the Priests of the Diocese of Lake Charles (D of LC) gather for the annual Convocation. During this time we receive presentations on a particular topic. Additionally, it is a time for the Priests to spend a couple days together in good and much needed priestly fraternity. I have been going to the Convocation for about 10 years now and can say that I enjoy them very much. Each of these aspects of the Convocation helps me as a Priest. First, continuing formation is essential for our well being as Catholics. As such, I speak about it regularly, since we all need on-going formation. We have to keep trying to learn our Faith better. The minute we think we have it all figured out or that we are not in need of any further education, well let's just say that sets us up to be used very easily by the Evil One. These seminars and presentations to us Priests, then, are good for us. Secondly, I thoroughly enjoy spending time with my brother-Priests. We have so many fine Priests in the D of LC. Spending a few quiet days together, reflecting on aspects of our lives as Priests and our priestly efforts makes us stronger and better Priests. As the Book of Proverbs says: "Iron sharpens iron" (cf., Proverbs 27:17). This time together also serves as a source of strength as we encourage one another to greater holiness, prayer, etc. This time together makes me think of how Our Lord would occasionally take the Apostles away to a "quiet place," a place away from the crowds, in order to instruct them and so that Apostles could enter more fully into the spiritual exercises that are so necessary for Priestly life and identity (cf. Some Latin at the 10:00 am Mass

As noted, some Latin will be employed at today's 10:00 am Mass. The Ordinary of the Mass (*Kyrie*, *Gloria*, *Sanctus*, *Agnus Dei*), the Preface, the Roman Canon, and the Our Father will be prayed in Latin. We all know by now the true teachings of the Church in this regard, namely that *Vatican II required that Latin and Gregorian Chant be maintained at holy Mass*. Our use of Latin on some occasions, then, is a small attempt to become more faithful to Vatican II, and this is what we all desire: to become more faithful to God, which we do when we become faithful to His commandments and to the teachings and precepts of the Church.

Preface One of the Saints – English Translation

Since the Preface at the 10:00 am Mass will be in Latin, I produce the text here so that you can review it before Mass or follow along during:

"It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give You thanks, Lord, Holy Father, Almighty and Eternal God. For You are praised in the company of Your Saints and, in crowning their merits, You crown Your own gifts. By their way of life You offer us an example, by communion with them You give us companionship, by their intercession, sure support, so that, encouraged by so great a cloud of witnesses, we may run as victors in the race before us and win with them the imperishable crown of glory, through Christ Our Lord. And so, with the Angels and Archangels, and with the great multitude of the Saints, we sing the hymn of Your praise, as without end we acclaim:" Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus ...
