Father Joe's Notes



My dear friends,

This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. This day honors the revelation of the divinity of Jesus to his closest disciples: Peter, James and John. He was transfigured, changed in appearance before them, radiating the light of God's power and might. On top of Mount Tabor, Moses and Elijah appear with him to demonstrate that in Christ is the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets. This revelation only came to a handful of his followers and only for a few moments; nevertheless, it points the way for all of us to understand the moment of God revealing his great love through Christ at the crucifixion and Resurrection. This is an important day.

The Feast of the Transfiguration reminds us to be watchful. We follow the Lord all the days of our lives, but those moments of clarity and glory are few and fleeting. The revelation of God's powerful love is amazing, but we have to pay attention so we do not miss them. It takes being present in the moment. We have to know where Christ is in our lives and be open to seeing what he wants us to see. The Spirit is at work in our lives, but we have to work with the Spirit to allow ourselves to see. After all, if the disciples did not go up that mountain, they would have missed this moment that was meant to give them strength, hope, and courage to face the coming Passion and death of Christ.

Have you had a moment where you knew the amazing power of God? Did you see the love of God shining in your life when you fell in love or welcomed the birth of a child? Did you see the light of Salvation when your sins were forgiven or you were Confirmed in the faith? Did you bask in the goodness of God when you studied Scripture or saw the splendor of Creation? Maybe you can't think of a moment when you have seen that great power of God. That is fine. Keep following Christ and ask where he is leading you in your life. Be open to new experiences and the love of God present in your life. Maybe your moment of revelation has not yet come. Be like Peter, James, and John and be open for it when it happens. Stay with the Lord in prayer and good works and be ready to see great things. You may witness the Transfiguration.
