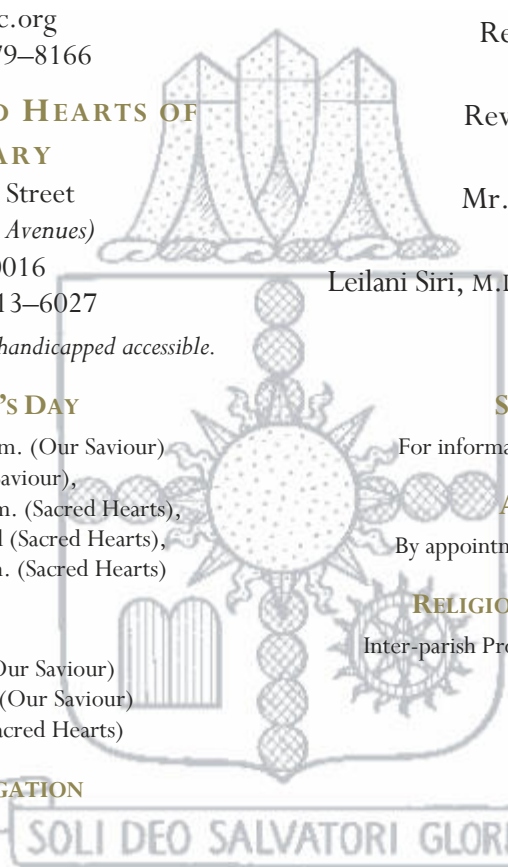

## FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

“I, John, saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God.” The splendid vision of the heavenly Jerusalem, which today’s Liturgy of the Word presents to us again, closes the Book of Revelation and the whole series of sacred books which comprise the Bible. With this magnificent description of the City of God, the author of Revelation indicates the definitive defeat of evil and the achievement of perfect communion between God and men. From the beginning, the history of salvation aims at this goal. Before the community of believers, who are also called to proclaim the Gospel and to witness to their own faith in Christ amid various trials, the supreme goal shines forth: the heavenly Jerusalem! We are all advancing towards that goal, where the saints and martyrs have preceded us down the centuries. On our earthly pilgrimage, these brethren of ours, who have passed victoriously through “great tribulations”, serve as an example, incentive and encouragement to us.

This Sunday, our archdiocese will collect an offering for **AID TO THE CHURCH IN CENTRAL AND EASTERN EUROPE**. From 1922 until 1991, the Ukrainian people lived under a repressive government that restricted both religious and cultural practice. In that time, Ukrainians faced multiple wars that left a suffering people in their wake. Still today, Ukraine is rebuilding from its difficult past.

Eastern Ukraine especially suffered for many years as a stronghold of communism. The Catholic faith was illegal or restricted, so atheism grew stronger and family values deteriorated. Today, the Church is working to rebuild these values.

Some women there find themselves in unplanned pregnancies. They believe that abortion might be their only answer. But, you have given these women an option to protect life. Your generosity has made it possible to create two homes for single mothers where they can live with their children. They receive help with child care and employment. You have not only helped them choose life, but also gave them tools to create stable living and working situations for themselves and their children.

I am counting on your usual generosity again this year. Your support is vital as they bring new life into the world. When you contribute, you become an

instrument of peace and join with Catholics around the world in solidarity with them.
