## A REFLECTION ON THIS SUNDAY'S GOSPEL

The most obvious danger which worldly possessions present to our spiritual welfare is that they become practically a substitute in our hearts for that one object to which our supreme devotion is due.

But, in truth, that our Lord meant to speak of riches as being in some sense a calamity to the Christian is plain ... from his praises and recommendation of poverty. "*Blessed are the poor: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.*" "*If you wish to be perfect, go sell what you have and give it to the poor and you shall have treasure in heaven.*"

Money is a sort of creation and gives the acquirer, even more than the possessor, an imagination of his own power and tends to make him idolize self. Again, what we have hardly won, we are unwilling to part with, so that a man who has himself made his wealth will commonly be frugal, or at least will not part with it except in exchange for what will reflect credit upon himself, or increase his importance. Even when his conduct is most disinterested and amiable (as in spending for the comfort of those who depend upon him), still this indulgence of self, or pride and worldliness, insinuates itself.

**ST. DOMINIC** was born in Calaruega in Spain around the year 1170. He studied theology at Palencia and was made canon of the church of Osma. He worked effectively against the Albigensian heresy through preaching and good example. To carry on this work he gathered together companions and founded the Order of Preachers (the Dominicans). He died at Bologna on 6 August 1221.

Edith Stein was born in Breslau, Germany (now Wrocław, Poland) in 1891 of Jewish parents. She studied philosophy under Husserl, the leading phenomenologist of his day. Inspired by the writings of St. Teresa of Avila, she was baptized on 1 January 1922. She taught in various schools from 1923 to 1933 until forced to resign due to anti-Semitic legislation. In 1933, she entered the Discalced Carmelite convent in Cologne where she received the name **TERESA BENEDICTA OF THE CROSS**. At the end of 1939, she moved to the convent at Echt, Holland, on account of the Nazi persecution of Jews, but in 1942, during the German occupation of Holland, she was arrested, transported to Poland, and killed (9 August) at the Nazi concentration camp at Auschwitz. She was canonized by Saint John Paul II in 1998 and declared co-patroness of Europe.
