Caravans of Camels

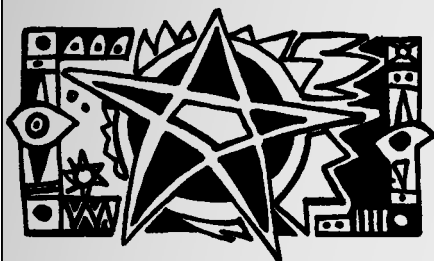
About those camels, we are not too sure about them. Yes, every nativity scene shows the magi seated on stately dromedaries, or leading their beasts of burden by bit and rein. But, quite honestly, the story of the Magi never tells us how they got there. They could have traveled on foot, in chariot, on horseback, elephants, or by camel—but we just do not know.

The reason we keep putting them on camels in our art is because of Isaiah's prophecy. He predicted that caravans of camels would fill Jerusalem, and that people from the East would come bearing gold and frankincense. "Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem!" he proclaims. "Your light has come."

In Matthew's story, the magi realize that Jerusalem's light has come. They follow the star and bring their gifts of gold and frankincense. Myrrh, too. By telling about these gifts, Matthew turns our attention back to Isaiah. Reading that prophecy, we realize that the light Isaiah mentioned is the Light of the World, Jesus Christ. When we see the magi seated on camels, we are remembering Isaiah. When we remember Isaiah, we remember the light that came to shatter the darkness of our world. Those camels carry hope.

Acts of the Apostles is the oldest recorded history of the early Christian Church and is packed with adventure and drama as the Church moves outward from Jerusalem to bring the message of the Lord to the people of the whole world. Wondering Why

The feast of the Epiphany is a more ancient feast of the Christian calendar than Christmas. In some cultures, the Solemnity of the Nativity, Christmas, is observed prayerfully, but the festivities, the gifts, and the gatherings happen twelve days later, on Epiphany. The word Epiphany is a Greek word that means a manifestation or revelation. On this feast we celebrate the manifestation of Christ to the world. The story of the magi is the evangelist Matthew's way of revealing who the newborn baby is, and that he comes for all the people of the world.

"Magi" is a Persian word that refers to the priests-astrologers of Zoroastrianism, a religion of Persia. In recounting this story, Matthew is drawing on the prophecy of Isaiah that a light will shine for the Gentiles. These magi were not the people to whom the Messiah had been promised. They are foreign, they do not know the God of the Jews, yet they are the ones to recognize the sign of a star that foretells the birth of a King, and are willing to follow the star to find the Christ. Because they are anticipating a royal person, they first go to the palace in Jerusalem to King Herod, who is King of Judea. Herod, a Jew, should know the prophecy and be eager to welcome the Messiah, but instead he is fearful of a loss of power. Herod begins, right at the start of Jesus' life, to conspire toward Jesus' death.

When the magi arrive at the house where the holy family is living (no stable or manger is mentioned in Matthew's account), they present three gifts. The gifts reveal the identity of the child Jesus. Gold is for kings, frankincense is used in worship, and myrrh is a spice used for the anointing of the dead. This illustrates that the child is a King, who is worthy of worship as God, but also a man who is mortal. In Bethlehem is the King of both Jews and Gentiles, who is both God and Man. This is a tremendous manifestation of a mystery beyond the expectation of the prophets, and it is now revealed to those outside the people of Israel.

The magi then return to their home country by another route. They are too spiritually sensitive to be taken in by Herod's plot and so avoid him, but the taking of another route also implies conversion. After encountering the Christ they will be different, they will travel by a different route.

On this feast of the Epiphany we can place ourselves into Matthew's story. We can keep ourselves open to recognize the signs God sends each of us that point us in the direction of his Son. We can change the direction we are traveling in our lives. And we can give to the world the gifts that are within us that manifest the identity of Christ, not gold, frankincense and myrrh, but gifts of love, compassion, joy, gentleness, kindness, understanding and peace. These are gifts that God has first given to us, we can give them to others, and when we do, Christ is made present to the world through each of us.

Eran hombres enamorados de las luces celestes—astrólogos, observadores de las estrellas, sabios sintonizados con los signos celestes, tal como lo dice Mateo. Una estrella extraña, que se movía por el firmamento, los dirigió hacia Israel. Al llegar a Jerusalén preguntaron dónde estaba el rey de los judíos recién nacido para adorarlo.

Herodes no estaba nada contento; es más, “se alarmó y con él toda Jerusalén” al saber del nuevo rey (Mateo 2:3). Así fue que convocó a los jefes de los sacerdotes y a los escribas, quienes recordaron lo que había proclamado el profeta Miqueas acerca del Mesías que nacería en Belén.

Así es que los sabios se pusieron en camino de nuevo, con la petición engañosa que Herodes les había susurrado al oído. La estrella apareció de nuevo y los llevó a la casa donde estaban el niño y su madre. Al verlo se postraron en tierra y lo adoraron, le ofrecieron regalos y regresaron a su país. Así termina la historia—tal como nos gusta recordarla.

Por supuesto que éste no es el final. Al no recibir noticias Herodes se enfurece y ordena la muerte de todos los niños menores de dos años. José, María y el niño huyen a Egipto. El poder no admite competencia, ni aun en la forma de un niño.

Pero Dios quiere que todas las personas se salven. Jesús vino a llevar a todos al reino de Dios y a habilitarlos de manera que puedan vivir la vida que Dios Padre les ha ofrecido como don. Las tinieblas del mal continúan amenazando, pero no vencerán mientras haya personas que buscan la luz, la siguen y dejan que esa luz los conduzca hasta el niño.
