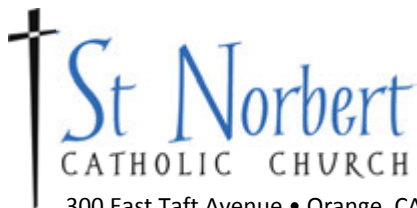

A Light to the Nations

Imagine God telling you, "Job well done! Congratulations!" How proud we would be to know that God's favor had rested on us.

Imagine God saying next, "Because you did so well with this task, I want to give you something more to do." Would you gulp in apprehension? Would you calmly accept the new directions? Or would you take on the new task with excitement?

In Isaiah's prophecy, God tells Israel, "You are my servant." These words comforted the chosen people because it reminded them that God proudly kept their friendship. But God went on. "It is too little for you to be my servant. ... I will make you a light to the nations." Ancient Israel would show not just their own people but also other nations how to walk in the light of God.

For Christians, this prophecy points ahead to Jesus, who became known as God's servant at his baptism. Jesus won God's pleasure as the longed-for Messiah. But God asked for something more—for Jesus to save all the nations. Jesus opened wide God's doors of salvation. He accepted God's task.

What about you? What task have you done that makes God proud? Is God asking you for something more? What might that be?

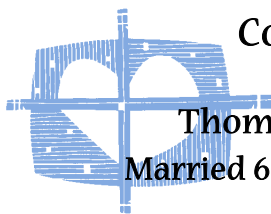

Wondering Why

This is the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. During this time we are encouraged to pray for the healing of divisions between Christians that we might be one in communion as we are one in baptism. In the early centuries all believers in Jesus belonged to one church, though there were many different customs, liturgical styles and even some differences in theology between communities. By the fourth century, much discussion was taking place about theological matters. Early councils of bishops, came together to discuss and resolve these differences. The Nicene Creed which we recite every Sunday was composed in 325 to clarify the questions concerning the humanity and divinity of Jesus. But discussions continued. The council of Ephesus was still struggling with the question of whether Jesus was fully God and fully human. The council determined that the faith that had been handed down by the apostles and reflected in scripture taught that Jesus was one person who had two natures, divine and human. Some Christian groups did not accept this, and a break in Christian communion occurred among followers of a Bishop named Nestorius. This theology persists within the Malabar Church of India and the Coptic

Churches of Ethiopia and Egypt.

The major break in the unity of the church occurred 600 years later in 1054, when because of political, cultural and theological reasons the Eastern Church split away from the Western Church. At that time, the Eastern Church began to be known as the *Orthodox Church* (which means "right teaching"), and the Western Church began to be known as the *Catholic Church* (which means "universal"). We became known as *Roman Catholic*, because the primary patriarch of the West, the Pope, was the Bishop of Rome.

In another 500 years, more separations began to appear. In northern Europe, John Wycliff and Jan Hus called for reform in the church and questioned some of the sacramental theology. A group called the Anabaptists, who did not accept the baptism of infants, formed in Northern Europe. The Anabaptists also rejected the primacy of the Pope.

The Renaissance in the 16th century introduced new ways of thinking into European consciousness which exalted the accomplishments of humanity. In positive ways this flowered into great art, music, literature and architecture. At the same time some philosophers began to question both the moral behavior and the theology of the Catholic Church. In Germany, Martin Luther protested against abuses he saw in the church's practices. Luther was a Catholic monk. He did not want to leave the church, but he thought the Church needed serious reform. Luther petitioned Rome to discuss these matters, but found instead that he was condemned, and eventually felt that he must leave the church in order to be faithful to his conscience.

John Calvin, a French lawyer and philosopher living in Switzerland had fundamental differences with Catholic sacramental theology. His beliefs were taken up by John Knox who spread them to Scotland and to England where they took hold as the Reformed Christian Church, the Presbyterians and the Puritans. After many of these people immigrated to the American Colonies, the Protestant denominations flowered in America. Descendants of the Anabaptists and the Puritans began the Baptist and Congregationalist denominations. The popular evangelical "mega-churches" such as Calvary Chapel, Saddleback and others are descendents of this Calvinist theology.

The third major reformer, Henry VIII of England broke from the Church for personal reasons. He wanted an annulment from his marriage to Catherine of Aragon but Rome refused to grant it. Henry declared himself head of the English Church, and granted himself the annulment. While maintaining most of the theology and sacramental practice of Catholicism, the Anglican Church of Henry separated from Rome over the question of governance. This branch of Christianity later evolved in the United States into the Episcopal, Methodist and eventually Pentecostal traditions of faith.

While this is a very brief explanation of the complicated process by which Christianity became divided over the centuries, it is helpful to understand how the various denominations evolved. In this week of Prayer for Christian Unity, let us pray that all who take the name Christian follow Christ faithfully and show love and respect for one another.

Reflexionemos sobre la Palabra de Dios

Nosotros debemos hacer lo mismo por los demás.

Jesús llegó a entender su propio llamado al leer y orar con el libro de Isaías, particularmente los cuatro poemas que se conocen como los “cánticos del siervo de Dios” o los “cánticos de Isaías”. Hoy escuchamos parte del segundo cántico en el cual el siervo profesa cómo fue formado desde las entrañas de su madre no sólo para llevar a Israel de nuevo a Dios, sino para ser luz de las naciones y su “salvación llegue hasta el último rincón de la tierra” (Isaías 49:6).

Aquellas personas que sirven a Jesús como discípulos han de unirse a esta obra de llevar la salvación de Dios al mundo. Pablo reconoce esto en su saludo a los corintios haciendo notar que su llamado es para ser apóstol de Cristo y enviado por Dios a la Iglesia de Corinto, cuyos miembros han sido consagrados por Cristo para llegar a la santidad. Pablo es enviado no sólo a ellos sino también a “todos los que invocan en cualquier lugar el nombre de Jesucristo” (1 Corintios 1:2).

Dios desea nuestra santidad. Cuando respondemos al llamado de conocer a Jesús como el Cordero de Dios aceptamos la invitación a participar en su santidad y a ser instrumentos para invitar a otras personas a hacer lo mismo.

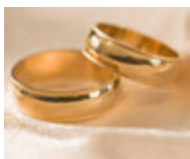
