Trusting in Humility

The dream for world peace ever stirs the heart of humanity. Imagine a world where nations stopped their aggression, where terrorists laid down their weapons of mass destruction, and where nations respected one another's territories and customs.

Closer to home, imagine a neighborhood where people got along, where diversity was treasured, and violence was no more. We all long for the security that comes from peace.

A sponsor is a faith friend who is accepting of people where they are in life and faith and is willing to share their love of Jesus with another. Sponsors do not need to be Catechists and do not have a direct teaching role in the process, but participate in discussions and in providing encouragement to the Catechumens and praying for them. Most sponsors report that they found this process to be a time of spiritual growth for themselves, as well as for the people coming into the Church. R.C.I.A.

A new Inquiry group is forming for those wishing to begin the process of becoming a Catholic, and for those who are not yet ready to make a commitment, but would like to investigate the teachings of the Church further.

The Inquiry groups are casual meetings to answer initial questions that people may have, to reflect upon God's presence throughout their lives, and to begin to become familiar with the Sunday scripture readings. A Study of World Religions

Have you ever wondered how different religions understand God and celebrate human spirituality? During the summer months we will offer a course on Comparative Religion which, in an atmosphere of respect, will explore the religious response to humanity's relationship with God in Christianity, Judaism, Islam, Buddhism, Hinduism, Polytheism and lesser known ancient and modern religions. We will be looking at the religious texts held sacred by different religions, the founders, prophets, and religious leaders in history, the rituals and symbols, and methods of prayer and meditation. The course will be presented through recorded DVD talks by Professor Charles Kimball, Professor of Religious Studies at the University of Oklahoma. Each presentation will include group discussion time, and a small handbook offering the principle elements of the major world religions will be available to participants.

We will meet this **Wednesday evening, July 9**, at 7:30 in the Ministry Center Library. The course will continue through the end of September with a two-week break at the half-way point at the beginning of August. This should be of interest to anyone who is curious about other cultures and how people of other religious traditions understand God.

Prayer & Meditation with Scripture

Due to Summer Socials on **July 8, 15 and 23**, the regular Tuesday evening Prayer Group sessions will **NOT** meet on those **three Tuesdays**. We will meet again on **Tuesday, July 29 at 7.30 p.m.** This hour of prayer time utilizes varying prayer forms each week, including *Lectio Divina*, centering prayer, prayer of remembrance, *Taizé* prayer and Ignatian meditation. It is a time to meet with others in quiet and peace away from the busyness and noise of the world.

Wondering Why

When Jesus prayed, he addressed God as Father. Actually, the Aramaic word he used which we translate as Father, was *Abba*, which is a very tender familial name which comes closer to meaning "Daddy" or "Papa." Speaking to God, or about God, with this familiarity would have seemed scandalous to most of the

Jews whose image of God tended to be more of a sovereign king, powerful but removed, a God to be worshipped and praised, but not someone with whom one could have a close personal relationship. Jesus understood God differently. As the Son, he knew the Father completely, and he teaches his disciples in another passage, that his Father is their Father, and our Father too.

In today's passage from Matthew, Jesus praises his Father for revealing his truths to the "little ones." By this, he does not specifically mean children. Rather, the word used is *Anawim*, which refers to people who are marginalized and without power. That could include children, but also would include those who are ill, or aged, handicapped, or believed to be outside the Law. It would include the impoverished, the homeless, beggars and sinners. Jesus says that the Father's truth will be understood by these people before it is understood by the wise and the learned. The wise and learned, of course, are the Pharisees, men who were highly educated in the Law and the interpretation of the Law. These are not as open to receive God's message because their hearts are closed by spiritual pride and their disdain for anyone in lower cultural or religious circles. It is the *Anawim* who accept Jesus and who realize their need for a Savior. In contrast, the Pharisees, believe they will be saved by their knowledge of the Law and criticize Jesus, who they feel does not take the law as seriously as they believe he should, because he makes exceptions whenever human need comes in conflict with the Law, such as feeding people or healing the sick on the Sabbath.

Jesus offers an invitation to all those who are burdened to come to him and rest. In some of the Prophets, and also later in Matthew's Gospel, the Law of the Jews is referred to as a Yoke. Jesus is telling the people here to trade the yoke of the Law for his yoke of love, for it is easier to bear. Later on, Paul will tell us that the Law cannot save, it can only condemn, because it is impossible to keep in its entirety, and the Law alone emphasizes human failings rather than God's love and mercy. The rest that Jesus promises is not inactivity, but rather renewal, refreshment and inner peace. It is through him that his followers will receive the energy to live the life of the Spirit which St. Paul discusses in the second reading.

St. Paul contrasts life according to the flesh with life lived according to the Spirit. Life according to the flesh leads to death, life in the Spirit leads to everlasting life. Men and women are continuously tempted to live according to the flesh through immoderate use of food and drink, disregard for chastity, attachment to material things, and compromising their values for monetary gain. In his letter to the Galatians, St. Paul gives instructions on recognizing the work of the Spirit. After listing the negative behaviors found in a life lived only in and for the flesh, St. Paul continues to instruct us in what we will receive as fruit of the life of the Spirit, which is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, fidelity, gentleness and self-control. (Gal. 5:16-26) This may not be the path of the world, but it is the path of Christ, and it leads to eternal life.

Reflexionemos sobre la Palabra de Dios

Cuando uno se imagina a un rey que viaja para visitar a su pueblo nunca nos lo imaginamos montado en un burro. Si el Llanero Solitario tenía a Silver y Roy Rogers tenía a Trigger, un caballo blanco de paso fino sería lo más apropiado para un rey y no un burro, aunque éste fuese de purasangre. Pero esta imagen del profeta Zacarías debió haberse clavado en la imaginación de Jesús, pues así fue como hizo su entrada triunfal en Jerusalén donde lo recibieron como el Mesías. No fue la entrada de un guerrero poderoso, sino la de un rey amable, cuya ley traería la paz a las naciones.

Algunas veces me lamento de que se haya quitado a san Cristóbal del santoral católico. Ese santo legendario, cuyo nombre significa "el que lleva a Cristo consigo", decía que el Señor resucitado había querido que sus discípulos lo llevaran consigo. Lo llevamos en nuestro cuerpo, en nuestra mente y en nuestro corazón. Lo llevamos al mundo cuando trabajamos por la paz y la reconciliación, y para que llegue a conocer al Padre.

Esto necesita nuestra voluntad de cargar el yugo de Jesús. Recuerdo haber escuchado una vez que los yugos que Jesús hizo en la carpintería bajo el asesoramiento de José eran fáciles de colocar sobre el cuello de los animales, para distribuir equitativamente el peso que arrastraban. El yugo que nos ofrece Jesús es su enseñanza acerca del reino de los cielos y cómo vivir en ese reino mientras estamos en el mundo. Eso significa revestirnos de la actitud de Jesús y de su espíritu de escucha atenta para conocer la voluntad del Padre. Eso es aprender dentro de la misma familia.

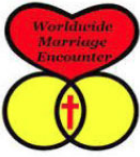
