Even so, death is hard to accept. No matter the circumstances, when someone dies, we have to make adjustments in how we live, work, act, and pray.

Especially difficult is the death that comes too soon. When someone lives a long life, at least we can thank God for offering the many opportunities that life can give. But when death comes to the young, it is harder to accept.

The Book of Wisdom offered comfort to those mourning the death of a youth. It praises a life lived in justice, not a life long in age. It says that the age worth honoring is not the one that comes with the passing of many years but the one marked by understanding and freedom from sin. It is not the quantity of years that matters, but the quality.

When death comes to the young, we remember that God treasures the gift of every human life, no matter the number of its opportunities for accomplishment.

R.C.I.A.

This **Thursday, November 6**, Pete Moriarty will speak about the Four Last Things: Judgment, Heaven, Hell and Purgatory. The following week, our topic will be The Church as the Body of Christ. Parishioners who are interested in any of the RCIA presentations or in sharing your faith with the RCIA community are always invited to join us for any session.

Anyone interested in beginning the process of becoming Catholic, or with questions about Catholic belief, is invited to come any Thursday at 7:30 p.m. to our Inquiry sessions. Inquiry is an open-ended small group discussion format designed to respond to questions or to begin a person's faith journey toward Catholic sacraments. Topics are determined by the interests expressed in the group.

Bible Studies

Monday Mornings: The morning group will meet this **Monday, November 3**, in the Ministry Center Library at 9:15. New participants are still welcome to join this overview of the whole Bible which will continue until Easter. Each session consists of a video presentation and discussion.

Tuesday evenings: This **Tuesday, November 4**, we conclude our *Beginners* Introduction to the Bible. This class is best for those wanting to get started reading Scripture who have not participated in a Bible Study group previously. We will talk about how to read and interpret the scriptures, how to locate texts in the Bible, and the meanings of the stories found throughout the scriptures. This group will meet on Tuesday evenings from 7:30 to 9 p.m. in the Ministry Center Library

Wednesday evenings: On **Wednesday, November 5**, we will continue our 8-week Bible Study on the Prophets of the Old Testament. We will continue to reflect upon the relationship between the Prophets and the Kings of Israel from David to the Babylonian exile, and how the religion of the Israelites continued to develop through Divine revelation and the preaching of the Prophets. This week we will look at the prophetic writings of the Prophet Ezekiel. This group meets on Wednesday evenings from 7:30 to 9 p.m. in the Ministry Center Library.

Our prayer group will gather in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel this **Tuesday, November 4**. This hour of prayer time utilizes varying prayer forms each week. It is a time to meet with others in quiet and peace away from the busyness and noise of the world. We gather for prayer in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel at 7:30 p.m.

Wondering Why

As we enter into mid-autumn nature reminds us that all material things come to an end. The weather becomes colder (well, it's *supposed* to become colder), flowers that have bloomed vibrantly during the summer fade away, leaves on the trees turn brown and fall to the ground. Winter is approaching and the world appears to be dying.

During this season of the year, various cultures also have ways of acknowledging the reality of death. Hallowe'en and the Day of the Dead both are filled with symbols of mortality. Yet, in a Christian context, they are also filled with promise and hope. Hallowe'en, which literally means "All Hallows Eve" is the night, or eve, preceding All Saints Day. The images of the dead or doomed which the night presents to our imagination are overcome by the rising of the morning sun and the triumph of all the saints. All the goodness and love that has been in humankind overcomes and conquers evil, just as the light of the sun dispels the darkness of night. Hallowe'en is nothing more than the prequel to All Saints Day. We are reminded of the darkness, so that the light is so much more appreciated.

In ancient Christian tradition the day before a Holy Feast was often a time of playfulness and anticipation. While Hallowe'en originally drew on some pagan customs of protection against evil, Christians quickly assimilated these older traditions and reinterpreted them to Christian faith. We see Hallowe'en not as a time when evil rules, but rather as the day before the rejoicing of the Saints. As such, the festivities and treats of Hallowe'en are not at all contrary to faith, but only a way of anticipating the Feast Day to come.

Following All Saints each year on November 2 is All Souls Day. In Hispanic cultures often an altar is set up during this period to remember loved ones who have passed into eternity. Pictures of friends and relatives who have gone to God are displayed often with little dishes of their favorite foods, bright flowers and skeleton images dressed in festive clothes. While this is a reminder of mortality, it is also a happy reminder that for Christians life does not end with the mortality of the body. The love that exists between people never dies and our lives continue with celebration and joy in another realm.

It is important for everyone to sometimes pause to look into the unknown. We will all die physically and it is necessary to remember that. In Christ, we will also all live eternally, and it is even more important to remember that. Our festivals and Holy Days at this time of autumn remind us of both, we will die, and we will certainly live, as do the saints in heaven and our own loved ones, with God for eternity.
