### Reflecting on God's Word

#### Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

We've all done it—passed street people without seeming to see, hear, or smell them sitting on the sidewalk begging. I usually encounter them when I'm dressed up to go to the theater or on vacation in a strange city. I'm slightly out of my comfort zone. I might catch sight of their shoeless feet or sunglasses or hear the thin request, "Spare change?"

Immediately my guard goes up and I pretend not to notice their existence, let alone their need. Chances are they aren't really blind anyway and they'd probably just spend the money on liquor.

The star of today's Gospel is a panhandler. Bartimaeus is blind, yes, but he is probably also homeless and filthy, a real nuisance to respectable citizens. Even so, it is Bartimaeus who recognizes Jesus as the Messiah, places all his faith in him, throws aside everything he has (his cloak), begs him for mercy, receives new vision, and follows Jesus on the way to suffering and death in Jerusalem. How desperate will we have to get before we can do the same?

At our RCIA sessions this **Thursday, October 29**, the topic will be the Communion of Saints, presented by Victor Quiros. The following week our topic will be the Beatitudes.

Anyone desiring to become a Catholic is welcome to begin the Inquiry Process on Thursday evenings at 7:30. Inquiry sessions are available year-round, except for holidays, and new participants are welcome at any time. Whether you have decided to become a Catholic, wish to learn more about the Church, or just have questions that you would like to discuss, we encourage you to join us. There is no obligation at this stage of the RCIA process, but for those who desire to continue to the reception of sacraments, the process usually takes a minimum of one year.

Our series on Church History will continue on **Wednesday, November 4**. The topics that evening will be *Eastern Catholic Churches* and *The Second Vatican Council*. ### What was Happening in the Fourth Century?

In the Easter season of 325 A.D. an invitation was sent to all the Bishops of the Christian world to gather in Nicaea to resolve the issue of Arianism, and to allow Arius to defend his position, as well as to decide other issues of disagreement in the Church. Over 1,800 bishops were invited, Athanasius of Alexandria reported that 318 attended, which is supported by several other sources, though some ancient historians state the number was as low as 250. Most were from the Eastern Provinces, Greece, Asia Minor, Syria, and as far away as Persia and India. Only five bishops attended from the Latin speaking provinces of the Western Church, one each from the territories of Great Britain, Gaul, Italia, the Danube, and Carthage. Twenty-two of the bishops in attendance came as supporters of Arius.

Many names of renown were among the participants, including a

generous Bishop from Myra in Southern Asia Minor named Nicholas. He did not know it yet, but he would become St. Nicholas, and later be known as Santa Claus, and become the patron saint and beloved friend of children for centuries to come. So, in a very real way, Santa Claus was present at Nicaea for the first Ecumenical Council of the Church. Each bishop was permitted to bring two priests and three deacons to assist him, so the total number of clergy in attendance was possibly over 1,900. Then still a young deacon, Athanasius from Alexandria was among the assistants. He would later become the Bishop of his city, and would spend virtually his whole life in an ardent battle against the heresy of Arianism.

The Council opened on May 20, 325, with the Emperor Constantine and Papal Legate Hosius of Cordoba presiding. The Bishop of Rome (the Western Pope), Sylvester I, did not attend. Though present, Constantine did not vote on any of the issues addressed by the Council. The top agenda item for the Council was this issue of Arianism. Arius was invited to defend his views. When some of the more provocative theses of his theology were stated, even the bishops originally supporting him declared them to be blasphemous. The discussions continued for a month. In the final vote, only two bishops from Libya remained as supporters of Arius.

In order to document the agreed upon doctrines, the Council took an ancient baptismal creed from the Jerusalem Church, probably very similar to what we know as the Apostle's Creed, and added fundamental statements defining the nature of Jesus and his relationship to the Father. Differences between the Apostle's Creed and the Nicene Creed, which we proclaim at Sunday Mass, can be easily seen by comparing the two line by line. Central to the issue, the Council stated that the Son is *homoousious* (consubstantial, in Latin) with the Father, meaning they were of the same essence or substance. Arius had said that the Son is *homoiousious* (notice the "i" in the middle of the Greek word), which meant of a similar, but not identical essence. In case that was not clearly understood, the new Creed elaborated: God from God, Light from Light, True God from True God, Begotten NOT Made, *homoousious*/consubstantial with the Father. Again and again in different vocabulary to make it very clear the Church Fathers proclaimed JESUS IS FULLY GOD. The Creed was adopted by a more than 99% majority vote on June 20, 325 AD. Arius was defeated.

The Nicene Creed was the most important document the Church had issued since the texts of the New Testament. We proclaim it every Sunday to this day. It was intended to put an end to Christian heresy, but it did not quite do so.

And so, the story of the Church continues...
