Third Sunday of Easter Jubilee Year of Mercy

How appropriate today's Gospel for this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, both because of the "breakfast" Jesus provides ("a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread") and the number of fish in Peter's net ("one hundred fifty-three") (John 21:11–12). Of the fish, Saint Augustine suggests that the roasted fish is the suffering Christ. Saint Gregory the Great adds that Christ lowered himself to swim in the "water" of our humanity; to be caught in the "net" of our death; to be "roasted" in his Passion on the fire of suffering. Saint Jerome claims that "one hundred fifty-three" represents the full number of known species of fish, signifying that the Church's "net" has room for all our widely diverse humanity, securing our unity-in-diversity in the hands of Peter and his successors. Having received God's mercy as "the beating heart of the Gospel," may the Church—we—"pattern [our] behavior after the Son of God who went out to everyone without exception" (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 12).

What was happening in the Sixth Century?

Veneration of Christian martyrs and their relics had been practiced since the first century of the Church, but by the sixth century the concept of sainthood expanded. Since western Europe, the Middle East, and northern Africa were increasingly Christian, there were far fewer incidents of physical martyrdom. People who lived lives of spiritual martyrdom, putting aside comforts and living lives of austerity and prayer were beginning to be recognized for their holiness both before and after their death.

No official process for the recognition of a saint had yet been developed, so saints were made by the acclaim of the people. When someone who lived a holy life died, people who knew him or her in that community might begin to refer to that person with the title of "Saint." Sometimes festivities and customs evolved regarding

the saint, usually celebrated on the day of the person's death. This became their Saint Day. The Church officially clarified that the honor given to these saints was something very different than the praise and glory to be given only to God. Only God was to receive adoration (*latría* in Latin), Mary was not to be adored as God, but rather with the highest veneration (*super-dulia* in Latin), and other saints a lesser degree of veneration (*dulia*). These terms and the difference between adoration and veneration were clearly stipulated at the Second Council of Nicaea in 787.

During the age of martyrs, most of the names of saints were of Greek, Latin or Hebrew origin; but now many Celtic, Anglo-Saxon, and German names start appearing on lists of saints. As the feast days of these saints proliferated, along with their festivities, processions, and devotions, there was a sense that time itself was becoming sanctified.

Much of this was good, as it provided examples of who had served Christ faithfully, but abuses began to creep into the practice. A profitable enterprise developed in the sale of relics of the saints, and to support that, a three-tiered measure of the value of a relic. A primary, or first class relic was an actual piece of the deceased's body, hair, fingernail, blood, a piece of bone, and so forth. A secondary relic was something the person had actually owned or used, such as a book, comb, clothing, or spoon. These were still important (just like you might keep your grandmother's favorite vase as a memory of her), but not as impressive as a first class relic. To complicate things further, there developed tertiary or third-class relics, which were simply pieces of cloth, leather, or paper which had been *touched* by a first or second class relic. It was difficult to prove the authenticity of first and second class relics, and nearly impossible to verify a third class relic.

The Church imposed simony laws against selling relics. These laws, however, did not extend to donations voluntary given to visit a particular relic, or to the reliquaries or containers in which the relic was housed. So, while one could not outright purchase a relic, one could purchase a gem encrusted reliquary in which a first, second or third class relic was encased. Theft of relics was also problematic and competing claims of different shrines and churches to hold within themselves the "true" relics of a particular saint, or even of Mary or Christ himself. Some of these may well have been the real thing, but there were also many forgeries.

Pious legends, often quite fantastic, also developed, and sometimes were embellishments of pagan stories and heroes. Some of the legendary material about St. Barbara, an early martyr, for instance, are confused with the German tale of Rapunzel. Some of these saints may not have been real people at all, such as St. Christopher, whose name means "Christ-bearer" and centers around a man who transports as small child across a river, only to realize that the child is an apparition of the Child Jesus. Possibly St. Christopher really did exist, and this vision happened, but there is no way to historically document it. After Vatican II, the calendar of "official" saints was revised, and many of these popular, but possibly not historical saintly figures were removed.

So, something that started out as pious devotion, recognition of a holy life, became corrupted by those whose lives were not so holy, and would lead to other problems in centuries to come.

San Jerónimo clama que los “ciento cincuenta y tres” representan el número de especies conocidas de peces, significando que la “red” de la Iglesia tiene espacio para todas las personas, reafirmando nuestra unidad en la diversidad en las manos de Pedro y sus sucesores. Habiendo recibido la misericordia de Dios como el “corazón palpitante del Evangelio”, que la Iglesia — nosotros— hagamos “suyo el comportamiento del Hijo de Dios que sale a encontrar a todos, sin excluir ninguno” (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 12).
