Occasionally Catholics ask, "Why is the Church always talking about

money?" They may think that the Church is wealthy and can do without the financial support of individual Catholics. If the Church were supported by government grants or special funds from the Vatican that might be true. Thanks to the separation of church and state, the Church in the United States is able to govern itself without interference from secular authorities. So the principal source of funding for the Church to perform all its ministries must be all of us. Everyone can give, though not all can give the same amount. We are called to support the Church financially in three ways. The first is with our commitment to God to support our local parish through our weekly offerings. Based upon the weekly collection, the pastor and finance council must cover all parish expenses. Our money in the collection basket ensures that we can serve and be served as Christ calls us. The second way is a donation or pledge to our diocese to fund ministries and programs that are too costly or complicated for any single parish to provide. The more we support our diocese, the more we ensure that the Church can train future priests and provide education, social services, and marriage and family services—to name but a few. The third way is through gifts that we choose to give to second collections, which benefit various causes in our parish, our diocese, or beyond. These are causes that the Church says are worthy of our support. We decide which ones we wish to support and with what amount as we are able. We, as the Body of Christ, can only fulfill our mission if there is money to pay the way. Let's all do our part, for the love of God.

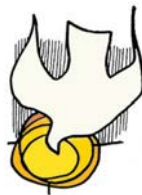
Catholicism: the Pivotal Players.

Each Confirmation Candidate will need a Catholic sponsor, who is confirmed and in good standing with the Church, and who is willing to participate in the weekly preparation sessions with the Candidate.



What Was Happening in the Twelfth Century?

The twelfth century produced some of the most interesting people of the middle ages. One of them, Pierre Abelard was a brilliant, though controversial, philosopher and theologian. He was born in 1079 near Nantes, Brittany to a knightly family. His father, Berengar, encouraged his son to study liberal arts and philosophy, at which Pierre excelled. Pierre did not wish to become a knight, and as a young man began to travel around France studying and participating in debates with other scholars.

Abelard arrived in Paris sometime in 1100 where he became attached to the Cathedral School of Notre Dame. Schools at the beginning of the scholastic period were different than we might imagine. The instructors and professors of the school lived mostly on the left bank of the Seine, an area which began to be called the Latin Quarter because Latin was the language spoken by the scholars. There were no classrooms, the students would gather outside of a professor's dwelling, sitting on bales of hay, and the professor would lecture those gathered from an upstairs window.

Also living in Paris, was the family of Canon Fulbert which included his niece Heloise. Heloise was a brilliant young woman who excelled in Greek, Latin and Hebrew literature. She desired further

education, but could not enter the Cathedral School, as enrollment was limited to unmarried men.

Coincidentally, around 1115 Abelard found living in Paris as a scholar was expensive, and he took residency in the Fulbert household in exchange for tutoring Heloise. He found her to be his intellectual equal and delighted in instructing her. In time, the two developed more than an intellectual attraction. Fulbert became suspicious and evicted Abelard, who took then found lodging at a house near the cathedral under construction. Heloise would secretly continue to meet him there, and she became pregnant. Abelard arranged for a priest of the cathedral to marry them in secret, so that it would not interfere with Abelard's status at the Cathedral School. When Fulbert discovered his niece's pregnancy, he was furious, and Abelard arranged for Heloise to go to his family home in Brittany where she would be safe. There she gave birth to their son, whom she named Astrolabe. Fulbert's rage continued, and it was not safe for Heloise to return home, so Abelard arranged lodging for her at a convent in Brittany, where she lived with the sisters, but did not take vows.

Heloise's cousins decided to take revenge against Abelard. One night they attacked and castrated him. He survived the attack, but as he could no longer function as a husband, he entered the monastery of St. Denis in Paris, and encouraged Heloise to remain in the convent permanently, which, reluctantly, she did. Although they would see each other only one time during the rest of their lives, the love between Abelard and Heloise never subsided and was expressed in letters they wrote to one another, which are published and available still.

Abelard continued to excel in the world of scholasticism, writing volumes of work on theology, scripture and Christian ethics. He was an innovative thinker and developed a rationalistic theology that was opposed by some other churchmen of his time including St. Bernard of Clairvaux. In 1122 Abelard left the Monastery of St. Denis and constructed a hermitage for himself, but young scholars still flocked to him for instruction. He established a school for them which he dedicated as the Oratory of the Paraclete. Heloise by now had taken solemn vows and began her own order of nuns also dedicated to the Paraclete. Abelard became abbot of the women's monastery as well, (at that time an abbess was overseen by a male abbot), and he compiled a Rule of Life for the new community which emphasized the importance of education for women.

Pierre Abelard passed from this life on April 21, 1142. His remains were returned to Heloise who had him entombed at the Monastery of the Paraclete where she was laid to rest next to him upon her death in 1163. After the French Revolution, they were both reburied together in a famous tomb in Pierre Lachaise Cemetery in Paris, where even today letters to them are left by separated lovers.

And, so, the history of the Church continues . . .

Pero somos nosotros la fuente principal de fondos que tiene la Iglesia para llevar a cabo todos sus ministerios. Todos podemos dar, aunque no todos podamos dar lo mismo. Nuestro llamado incluye el apoyo económico a la Iglesia de tres maneras. La primera es el compromiso que hacemos con Dios para apoyar a nuestra parroquia con nuestra ofrenda semanal. El párroco y el consejo de finanzas deben cubrir todos los gastos de la parroquia con la colecta de cada semana. El dinero que ponemos en las cestas hace posible que podamos servir y ser servidos tal como nos pide Cristo. La segunda manera es hacer una donación o promesa financiera a nuestra diócesis para que se puedan costear los ministerios y programas que son demasiado costosos o complicados para que una parroquia pueda ofrecerlos por sí sola. Mientras más ayudemos a nuestra diócesis, más nos aseguramos de que la Iglesia pueda entrenar a futuros sacerdotes, proporcionar educación en la fe, servicios sociales, y servicios para los matrimonios y de índole familiar—sólo por mencionar algunos. La tercera manera en que podemos ayudar es a través de lo que decidamos contribuir en las segundas colectas, lo cual beneficia las diferentes obras de nuestra parroquia, nuestra diócesis y más allá de ellas. Éstas son obras que la Iglesia considera dignas de nuestro apoyo. Nosotros decidimos cuáles queremos apoyar y con qué cantidad nos es posible hacerlo. Nosotros, como Cuerpo de Cristo, podemos hacer nuestra misión sólo en la medida en que haya dinero para proveer las necesidades. Por el amor de Dios, hagamos nuestra parte.
