**Blast From the Past(or)
Solemnity of the Epiphany of our Lord
January 6, 2019**

Fear is a condition to which all of us can relate. As a defense mechanism, fear can protect us from danger. As a phobia, fear can be debilitating, robbing us of the full life experience. I am afraid of spiders, for example. Once I lived with a seminarian who was bitten by a Brown Recluse Spider. My fears were realized. Every spider is now a Brown Recluse to me. That's fear. Other catalysts of my fears include Joy Behar and the movie *The Wizard of Oz*. I have an inordinate fear of chain-smoking clowns who juggle at Bar Mitzvahs (a long story, but a melee took place, and that's all I'm permitted to say under advisement of counsel at this time). I'm fearful of those who politicize Jesus, presuming to moralize to me that Jesus was once a migrant while failing to protest with equal vigor that Jesus was also once unborn (interestingly, this fact belies their own fears). Today's Solemnity reveals the fear of King Herod. After the Magi delivered the news about the Newborn King, Herod was 'greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him.' How rich: the king is fearful of a baby. This fear of Herod remains. A baby changes everything. How many feel threatened? From whence does this fear come? At this Epiphany, we recognize that our laws still fear a child. But with the Magi we offer our gifts to the Newborn King and prostrate ourselves before Him for the salvation of the world. Though our Country holds 'sacred' the right to eradicate the little ones just as King Herod did, let us encourage one another in a newborn Year: 'fear not, little flock.... for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the Kingdom....' (Lk 12: 32). Happy New Year!!!

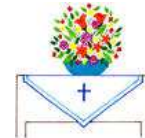

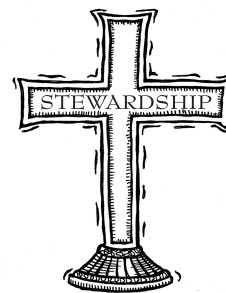


Attention Young Adults!
