**27TH Sunday in Ordinary Time**

“So out of the ground the Lord God formed every beast of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name.” (GENESIS 2:19) The creation story reminds us of two important points. Just as past generations built our Church, it is now our responsibility to continue to nurture and develop these gifts for future generations.

**Listening Sessions for parishioners who need to speak**

Fr. Leo will make himself available after each Mass the weekend of Oct 6 & 7 to all parishioners who need to speak about the recent wave of abuse of minors by clergy and other church personnel that has recently been on the media, as well as the accusations against Cardinal McCarrick. **PERFECT EXAMPLE OF AN AMERICAN CALLED TO HOLINESS**

To all parishioners and friends, you are invited to attend a movie on one great example in America of someone who was called to holiness and lived that out: **WON'T YOU BE MY NEIGHBOR?** This is the story of Mr. Fred Rogers who devoted his whole life ministry in helping children love themselves as they are: children of God. Please join us at St. Mary's Parish Hall this Sunday, October 7 at 4 PM. The movie is 90 minutes long. It is a wonderful movie for discussion.





**HOW AM I A “CHILD OF GOD”?**

Interestingly, we just celebrated the Feast of St. Therese of Lisieux, who is now a doctor of the Church, for her contribution to the development of the Spirituality of Childhood. In his exhortation, Pope Francis addresses two modern heresies that continue in the hearts of many Catholics: Modern Gnosticism and modern Pelagianism. Without oversimplification, modern Gnosticism has to do with a certain mindset that they have the right answers and the right theology, even though they are a minority among Catholics. This heresy is present in both “conservative and liberal Catholics.” They believe that they are enlightened, even though it is contrary to Church documents and beliefs. As to modern Pelagianism, there are Catholics who are convinced that all Catholics should be doing things a certain way, their way. They often are rigorists when it comes to devotions, penances and liturgy. For example, some are convinced that the Latin Tridentine Mass is the only true way to celebrate Holy Mass. (Although this is acceptable, celebrating Mass in the language of the people and following the norms of Vatican II is also very acceptable for Catholics.)

As the Nicene Creed proclaims, we each profess: “I believe in one, holy, Catholic and apostolic Church.” This is at the heart of the Gospel of today and of Pope Francis’ exhortation to holiness. We are members of the family of God, that is, the Church. We are called to the oneness that is at the heart of our Trinitarian God. In our Gospel, to test Jesus the Pharisees (their very name means “the separate ones”) asked his opinion on divorce. Jesus goes beyond Moses back to the Book of Genesis. He states that God, from the beginning, joined them as one. He replies, “Therefore, what God has joined, let no one separate.” The physical union of husband and wife is a sacramental revelation of the deeper spiritual truth of communion.

Separation consciousness focuses on surfaces and superficiality, where everything seems unconnected and detached. Jesus would have us go deeper to a consciousness of oneness with God and with each other. In fact in His very Person, Jesus is the paradigm of this new awareness that everything is one. And the source of this unity is God, Our Father. Divorce and separation is indicative of our separation and sinfulness. Children are the fruit of our seeking unity with each other and with God. And to embrace a child is to embrace the least and therefore to embrace Christ. And to embrace Christ is to embrace God.

**In my actions, do I foster unity or separation? Are there people, or certain kinds of people that I avoid, maybe out of fear, or judging them to be repulsive? Do I secretly hold the view that the practice of my Christianity puts me a cut above others? Or does my view of holiness put me on the same level as public sinners that I know? Do I at times criticize or counsel other Catholics or Christians because they are not doing it right or not following the rules of the Church, as I see it. Do I believe that in God’s eyes, there are some Christians who are more noble, and there are some who are less noble? Or do I truly see everyone as a child of God? Do I see “my brand of theology” as better than what most Catholics follow? Do I secretly feel superior to other Catholics or Christians because of the way I practice and live my faith? Or do I really believe that “all is gift” and could be taken away, if God so wished, and that even my cooperation with God’s grace is a gift? Because of this, I am no better than “the bums on the street” or “the public sinners” that I know.**
