A Message from the Pastor

July 15, 2018
Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

During the school year our parish is assisted at weekend Mass by the Salesian priests from Don Bosco High School in Ramsey. From time to time, we share with you some spiritual reflections by one of their members, Father Steve Ryan. He is currently assigned to their ministries in Florida.

CALLED

The overall theme for summer 2018 at Camp Mary Help is CALLED. Each week of the summer camp we've been reflecting on being called: called to serve (week 1), called to lead (week 2), called to pray (week 3), called to love (week 4), called to joy (week 5) and called to be saints (week 6).

Giving young people a clear understanding that their lives are a gift from God who is calling them to do something with it, is an important thing. It helps them realize that their lives have a meaning. We are all on a journey to become happy and holy – ultimately to get to Heaven. God is calling us through His Son Jesus Christ to walk the path of life as a servant, as a leader, as a prayer, as a person of charity and with joy. He wants us all to be saints.

Summertime is a good time for all of us to stop and think about how we are living our one and only life. Do we spend time considering that our life is God's gift to us and that he expects results? Do we really comprehend that God wants us to become saints? To become holy is the goal – it's really the only goal.

Fail to plan? Plan to fail. So... what's your plan?

Six years ago before taking over the role of Director of Mary Help of Christians Center in Tampa, Florida, I made a plan. As I finished walking the Camino of Santiago of Compostela, I wrote it down. Here was my plan:

1. Be present to the people I serve and be joyful.
2. Live in the present moment.
3. Keep people first before doing things. Especially watch out for getting so caught up in activities and projects that I fail to be sensitive to those around me.
4. Stay prayerful and cling to the Eucharist.
5. Work hard. Overcome the temptation of laziness and don't quit when the trials come.

As I move from Tampa to a new assignment in New York, I am glad I made that plan. To be honest, I haven't lived it perfectly and at times in fact, I've lived it poorly. However, if I didn't have it as a roadmap these past few years, things would have gone a whole lot worse.

We all must comprehend that we are called. Our life is not our own. It's a gift from God. We need to respond, for the fulfillment of our Calling, with a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. We need to respond to our call with a plan for holiness. Let's pray:

DID YOU KNOW that **YOU** are now old enough to become an **ALTAR SERVER** here at Guardian Angel parish?

Serving at weekend Mass is very special, and you have probably noticed we have many young people in this ministry – from 4th grade up through high school! It is an important responsibility, and a wonderful way to serve God and the Church! It's a great help for Father Don, our visiting priests and me!

Altar servers assist the priest with the celebration of the liturgy. They carry the candles for the procession, hold the book (Roman Missal) for the priest and help with setting up the altar for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

All altar servers receive training so that you will be ready. The alb (white robe) you will wear at Mass is provided by the parish, so there is no cost involved. We just ask that you exercise this ministry reverently: with prayer and care.

There are two altar servers assigned at each Mass and servers are generally scheduled to serve once or twice a month.

The coordinator of altar server ministry, Mr. Michael Schmidt, will teach you about serving at weekend Mass. YOUTH MINISTRY

Summer '18 Prayer Challenge

With summer upon us, we can expect longer days and more free time since we won't have any more assignments to worry about — except for one. This summer, I'd like to challenge you to work on your communication with Christ. Strengthening your communication with Christ starts with understanding that prayer is the best way to communicate with Him. PRAYER — it can be so intimidating. Whether you'd like to revamp your prayer routine or don't have a routine you've made your own yet, there are many ways you can work on your prayer life. My hope is that at least one of these options (or a combination of them) is a good match for you — that they not only strengthen your communication with Christ, but also build your armor as His disciple.

15 Days: Saint the Way to Salvation

Saints are great examples of prayer. Think of them as older siblings who've already been through what's to come. Their testimonies are a great resource for when we are in need of guidance on our walk to salvation. Pick a saint and over the next 15 days, learn about their journey to God's Kingdom. Spend time reflecting on why God chose them and let that be a foundation for discovering just how much Christ values you.

Where to Start: Try reflecting on your personal journey and consider revisiting saints you've made personal connections with, like your confirmation saint or a saint who shares your name. If you're looking for support in an area in which you're struggling, try searching for saints who were known for prayer, forgiveness, or conversion from lustful lives. If you're interested in historical structure, try searching by geographical region, time-period, or even feast days. If you're still having some trouble, here are some saints I've made connections with in the past:

St. Thomas Aquinas
St. Patrick of Ireland
St. Pio of Pietrelcina
St. Michael the Archangel
St. Teresa of Avila

30 Days: Scripture is Life

It's the study guide God has given us for our journey to His Kingdom. Choose a Bible verse each day for the next 30 days and find ways to build a personal connection with it. Consider how that verse is applicable to your life and reflect on why God chose it for you.

Where to Start: It can be hard to open the Bible and just start reading. Luckily, the Church provides us with an awesome reading plan, hand-selecting readings for every day of the year!

You can choose a Scripture verse from the Gospel or Psalm for that day. You could also reflect on your overall feeling that day and look up verses that are relevant to your personal experience. These are a few verses I recommend:

John 4:14
Psalm 119:105
Matthew 7:7
Revelation 21:4
1 Corinthians 10:13

Write them down on individual pieces of paper and keep them in a jar. Pull from out a name each day and devote your prayer to that person.

Where to Start: There are many ways to offer prayer for others. As you acknowledge their beauty and intercede for their holiness, you can also fast for them, offer a rosary for their needs, spend a few minutes in front of the Blessed Sacrament, recite a Hail Mary for them first thing in the morning or last thing before bed, offer them up in Mass, go on a run and offer the struggle for them — the possibilities are endless!
