John recounts for us the details of his vision. An angel bearing the seal of the living God demands that the land and sea not be destroyed; huge crowds stand before the throne of the Lamb crying out that salvation comes from God; angels gathered round and praised God; an elder questions John and explains that those dressed in white are the ones who have survived the great period of trial.

Second Reading: 1 John 3:1-3

Once again John speaks to us of love. He points out to us the great love that the Father has for us by allowing us to be called children of God. John explains that the world doesn't recognize us because it never recognized Jesus. Our future will be revealed to us and in that light we shall see him as he is.

Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12a

When Jesus saw the crowds of people he went up to the mountainside gathered his disciples around him and began to teach them. This lesson in love has come to be known to us as the great Sermon on the Mount" or The Beatitudes."

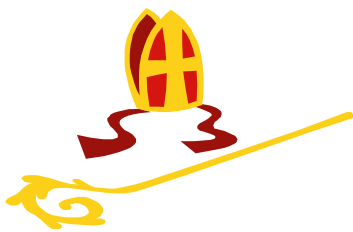

ASA - A Model Early Childhood Center

All Saints Academy hosts an extensive Early Childhood Center that is considered a model setting for young children of the Parsippany area. It includes a PreSchool level for three-year old children, a PreKindergarten program for four-year old children and a full day Kindergarten. The teaching team has developed a highly enriched language and mathematics program based on the combination play and pre-academic skills. Vibrant teaching and genuine learning occurs through the interweaving of science, technology, engineering and math in daily classroom lessons.
