From the Pastors Desk -

Mark 12:28-31

In this Gospel, Jesus gives us two very simple commands. They may seem easy enough to follow, but stop and think about what loving God and loving others as ourselves really entails for a minute. In reality, this is not so easy. Jesus' two commandments are linked. We cannot love God with all our strength if we cannot first love the people of God, the creation of God, the very image of God. To hate, ignore, or exclude a fellow human being is to hate, ignore, or exclude part of the manifestation of God. Jesus lived to teach and embody, especially those who society had written off like beggars, the diseased, and criminals. Jesus would have defined "neighbor", as the entirety of humanity. Shouldn't we do the same? Think this week about the people in your life who you fail to treat as your neighbor, and strive to treat them with love in order to grow in God's love.
