Catholic Scout Retreat 2018



Fear Not, Be Strong

Our retreat theme unexpectedly took on additional meaning when we learned that high water across the entrance road at *Camp Shawnee* in Knob Noster State Park would prevent us from holding our annual retreat at the planned location. Upon learning of this news less than 40 hours before the retreat was scheduled to commence, retreat staff led by Mary Stoner who serves as retreat Co-chair, immediately began orchestrating contingency plans. Deacon Ken Albers came to the rescue by securing the former *Archbishop O'Hara High School* facility in Kansas City. The retreat program was condensed into a day-retreat for youth participants, while the adult *Ad Altare Dei* religious emblem counselor training and *National Catholic Leadership Development* programs were conducted as planned. The retreat attendance fee was reduced to \$10 per person, and lunch was provided.

More than 100 participants showed up in the rain for our abbreviated Day-Retreat. In attendance were scouts and scouters from Troops 32, 54, 111, 124, 161, 220, 221, 391, 857, 865, 717, as well as Packs 98 and 717. Scouts from these units are chartered by or are affiliated with the following parishes: St. Mark's (T865), St. Columban (T857), Holy Spirit (T54), St. Mary's (T221), Our Lady of the Presentation (T391), St. Sabina (T111), St. John Francis Regis (P98), or with the following churches: East Alton Community of Christ Church (T161), St. Paul's United Methodist Church (T32), and Lee's Summit Christian Church (T220).

Youth participants rotated through six program stations led by the retreat youth staff. The stations were titled: **Buckets of Choice, Plutonium Transportation, Improv, Mousetraps, Collages, and Survival Bracelets.** John Griffith served as the retreat faith program director, while Ben Thomas, Tristan Spooner, Ethan Mitchell, Adam Milam, and Logan Mitchell served as senior youth staff. 16 adult scouters attended *Ad Altare Dei* religious emblems counselor training led by Dave Tracewell and assisted by John Wessling and John Pileggi. 16 adults also attended the Catholic Leadership Development session led by John Ryan. Preparing lunch was a challenge given that there was no functioning kitchen inside the school and that it rained virtually all morning. With the assistance of Deacon Ken Albers and the St. Regis Knights of Columbus council, several charcoal grills were made available to the retreat kitchen staff which used the St. Regis storage shed as a shelter while grilling 150 hamburgers for lunch. The kitchen staff included Melissa Adams, Diane Beatty, Claudia Rodriguez, Joe Rozell, John Swartz and Dcn. Albers. Diane Beatty, assisted by members of the youth staff, performed a religious emblems informational presentation that reviewed the numerous religious emblems and awards of each faith that are available within scouting for youth and adults.

To conclude the day, Fr. Joe Powers celebrated mass in the school gymnasium. He was assisted by Deacon Fred Lange of Troop 54. Sean Holland of Troop 80 at Holy Cross parish served as cantor and provided music and hymn programs for the liturgy. Tristan Spooner and Ben Thomas served as lectors during the Liturgy of the Word.

Bronze Pelican



The Bronze Pelican is a diocesan award presented to adults who have given service to Catholic Scouting through the programs of the Boy Scouts of America. Any adult who has shown awareness and concern for the spiritual development of our Catholic youth may be nominated. Nominees do not have to be registered with BSA or be Catholic.

St. George Emblem



The St. George Emblem is awarded by the National Catholic Committee on Scouting upon recommendations from the local diocesan committee. It recognizes the recipient's outstanding contributions to the ideal of "Scouting is

Youth Ministry". Recipients do not have to be Catholic or registered members of BSA - just long-time outstanding supporters of Scouting in the Catholic Church. This award qualifies the recipient to wear the adult religious award square knot.

Carol Jean DeFeo

May 12, 1946 - October 21, 2018

Carol was a longtime member of Pack 30 and Troop 30 at *Christ the King* parish in Kansas City. She, alongside her late husband Dr. Fred DeFeo, were instrumental in keeping these units in operation well after the *Christ the King* parochial school closed. It would be difficult for any scouter active in the Pioneer Trails District at any time during the past 30 years not to know or at least be familiar with Carol. She has served in numerous scouting positions at the unit, district, and council levels.

In 2006, Carol became the Catholic Committee on Scouting Communications Chair. In this role, it was

her responsibility to edit and publish the *Piercing Arrow* newsletter that you are currently reading. She continued in this position until handing the reins over to R. Scott Smith in 2010.

Carol was laid to rest at Mt. Olivet Cemetery in Raytown, MO on October 26, 2018. The hundreds of Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Eagle Scouts and adult scouters will never forget how she touched each of their lives in a positive way through scouting. She will be greatly missed.

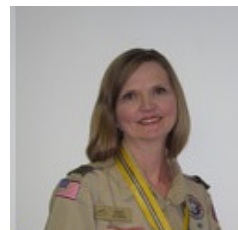

Religious Emblems Procedure Changes



The process of ordering religious emblems has changed and is now in effect. The new procedure is as follows:

- Visit the Catholic Committee on Scouting website:
<https://www.catholicscouting-kcsj.com>
- Click RELIGIOUS AWARDS at the top of the page.
- The order form is on the right side of the page under RELIGIOUS EMBLEM ORDER FORM. This form reflects the new pricing for all emblems.
- Complete the form and click Proceed to Payment. You'll be directed to a secure on-line payment site to complete your transaction.
- Mail the signed emblem application from the workbook to me.

Your order will be processed upon receipt of the application. Your emblems will be mailed to you or you can arrange with me to pick them up.

I will use the information from the on-line form to contact you regarding the annual religious emblem ceremony and to format certificates for the youth recipients. Please provide *first* and *last names* of the youth recipients. There's an area under each emblem category for the names.

The printed Religious Emblems Request Form previously used is outdated and will no longer be accepted.

What's New?

- The Parent Pin or Mother's Pin as it's sometimes referred to will be an option when ordering. It will not be automatically included with your order as it has in the past. There are two options when ordering your emblems: you can order the emblem only or the emblem and parent pin.
- I will make one weekly trip (Friday morning) to the Post Office to mail emblems. If you need a quicker turnaround, you will need to come to my residence to pick up the emblems.
- On-line payments for all emblem orders.

What's the Same?

- You will still need to mail the signed emblem applications from the workbook to me.

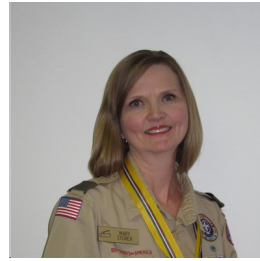

Philmont- a Rare Life Experience

I am writing this to show my appreciation and to share some wonderful experiences that my wife Donna and I had at Philmont this summer.

We were able to take the train which was super. We have not been able to see much of the mountains in our life, and it was truly spectacular.

When we arrived at the training center and completed check in, we were assigned to a very large wall tent with concrete base, two beds, a locker and even electricity and lighting. It was quite spectacular compared with Bartle and Naish. The mountains surround you with beauty and God's presence.

The young adult staff was great and very helpful. The food was terrific.

We met leaders from all over the country. Many had brought their children and everyone we met was just plain happy. My most important observation is that in the whole time there, I did not hear one argument, one complaint, or one harsh word. It is truly a Godly place.

It is very unfortunate that some of the mountains were black from the fires and sometimes we could smell burnt wood when the breeze was right. Other mountains were green and untouched. As a result of the fire, many mule deer wandered around the camp. Many had burns on their backs and flanks. One day Donna noticed a doe that was pregnant and had burns on her body. The next day we saw her again with her new fawn.

It is painful that so many young people could not trek at Philmont this year, but they have

been guaranteed a spot next year; and the staff will be ready for them.

Donna had a great time as a "Silverado," as defined by one of my Scouts as someone who is too old to do scouting any more. A Silverado is a spouse who does a lot of fun things. Donna toured the mansion, went to Cimmeron, made jewelry, used a lathe to make a wooden pen and hung out with me for dutch oven cobbler, barbeque night and an ice cream social. She also went to Mass with our group. Of course she talked to anyone who would listen. There are Scouters all over the country that know more about our grandchildren than I do.

With the assistance of our local Catholic Committee on Scouting, I was able to take the one week training titled "Scouting in the Catholic Church." The course was led by members and clergy from the National Catholic Committee on Scouting. We were very fortunate to have our national Chaplin Fr. Kevin Smith and Bishop Daniel Conlon from the diocese of Joliet, our national liaison to the National conference of Catholic Bishops. The course was outstanding including all phases of youth ministry in Scouting, working with our local Catholic committee, and training on the four parts of National Catholic Leadership Development: Leadership, Holiness, Conversion, and Worship. We were able to go to Mass together every day and to share our faith with others of our group. Our very own Fr. Joe Powers is the new chaplain of the National Committee on Scouting.

Thank you so much Catholic Committee and National Catholic Committee.

Thank you God the Holy Spirit who breathes life into us all.
