Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

The Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) works to be a voice of hope for those on the margins of society who experience the realities of living in poverty. CCHD supports programs to heal the wounds of crime and violence, advocate for more just policies, protect God's creation and develop strong communities. Your donation to CCHD will help build a society where all have a voice and all know their inherent dignity.

Often when juveniles are arrested, their record follows them their whole lives, decreasing their chances of finding gainful employment and increasing their chances of re-offending. Together with the Catholic Bishops, groups like the Direct Action and Research Training Center (DART) in Miami are working to reduce the number of juvenile arrests, giving children a real chance at success. Thanks to a strategic national grant from CCHD, DART is working with school and law enforcement officials to decrease the number of school-based arrests and promote alternative, constructive interventions that give children a second chance at their future. Because of their work, school systems are now able to implement restorative justice practices affecting over 65,000 students and resulting in a decrease in suspensions and arrests.

This collection is the primary source of funding for CCHD's many anti-poverty education programs and grants, like the one that supports DART. Funding from the collection offers new hope every year to those living in poverty throughout the United States. Please remember 25% of the Collection's proceeds stay here in our Diocese helping our Father English Community Center, Hope House, Straight and Narrow and the Hispanic Information Center to fight poverty in our communities and defend the dignity of our neighbors.
