Below is an e mail I received from Msgr. John Hart regarding our new Parochial Vicar visiting family in Poland.

Dear Pastors,

I write to inform you about the unfortunate situation that you, your parishioners and your newly assigned parochial vicar are confronting and to update you with the latest information provided to me by our sources.

I have been told that USCIS (the agency that oversees the applications for Religious Worker Visas) is understaffed and has an overload of applications. On the USCIS site it states that R-1 Visas should receive a decision within a six month period. This is not correct. Our source told us that across the country the waiting time for application decisions is now running anywhere from 7-11 months. This new information could mean that your assigned parochial vicar may not receive an answer to his application until September, at which time the original approval notice will be mailed to him. I will notify him as soon as we receive the original approval notice, so he can schedule an appointment with the Consulate Office to receive his Visa. The documents will be mailed to him overnight mail to expedite his returning to the diocese as soon as possible. I know that it is an inconvenience to you but at this point USCIS is dictating the situation.

This is a regrettable situation, and I am sorry for the awkward inconvenience it has created.
