Protect Viable Babies

The New Jersey Catholic Conference of Bishops has approved a statewide postcard campaign urging the State Senators and Assembly Members to support the NJ Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act. If passed, this bill would protect babies in the womb at 20 weeks, that is 5 months and beyond. Did you know that in New Jersey, abortion is legal throughout all 9 months of pregnancy and that late term abortions are routinely destroying viable babies? 70½ OR OVER WITH AN IRA?...

While there are many ways to give to the Bishop's Annual Appeal, there is a particularly beneficial opportunity if you are 70 ½ or over and have an IRA. If you are in this category, the IRS requires you to take a required minimum distribution from your IRA each year. As a result, this distribution is added to your taxable income and increases the amount of taxes owed to the government. However, instead of taking your required minimum distribution, you can instruct your IRA investment manager to donate this distribution to a charity such as the Bishop's Annual Appeal and this automatically omits this amount from your adjusted gross income.

This tax benefit can be realized by all qualifying individuals, whether you take the standard deduction or itemize your deductions. This can be a significant benefit to you and a great way to support the work of the Bishop's Annual Appeal. ***If you are considering making a charitable donation using your IRA required minimum distribution, please be sure to first discuss this with your financial or tax advisor to make sure it is right for you.***
