All three readings today call you to witness and proclaim Jesus, The Good News. In today's gospel readings Jesus tells you "I have come to set the earth on fire", also He refers to His coming as bringing divisions to the earth. Many of you may have already experienced this division when preaching the gospel. Our own friends and families turn away when the conversation comes to the teachings of Christ, which are counter-cultural in today's society. You, who have the courage to witness for Christ, are stepping into the arena of the martyrs. Expect rejection and crucifixion, Christ did. St. Paul tells you in today's second reading "to persevere in running the race, not to grow weary and lose heart, for your struggle is against sin". The gospel of Christ makes the world uncomfortable because it embodies truth and calls you to change your ways. This change includes the end to endorsing sin by taking the easy way out. You must speak Christ's truth, which has no grey areas and no need for political correctness. When you are courageous for Christ, you step into His death, His struggle, and His victory. Christ does not call you to be neutral in order to keep peace, but to set our world on fire with the truth of the Gospel message. We have learned over the last few years of the many Christians being martyred for their faith. You are also called to martyrdom by giving up sin, spreading the gospel in the face of division, and committing yourself totally to the mission of Christ. You can wear the crown of "White Martyrdom" by offering your suffering as a witness for the Lord. God is offering you a chance to share in His greatest work of salvation, "The Cross".
