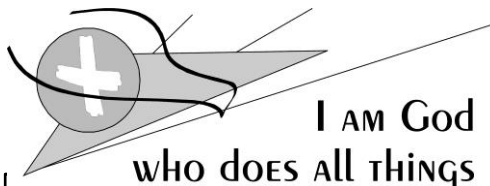
"ARE YOU HIS?"
