HOLY WEEK

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday when the Church celebrates the Lord's entrance into Jerusalem. Palms are blessed and distributed to parishioners as they participate in this celebration. The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ is recited at every Mass and The Living Stations of the Cross will take place in the evening.

On Monday, at the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist in Paterson, Bishop Serratelli will bless the holy Oils to be used by parishes throughout the Diocese of Paterson. All are welcome to attend at 7pm.

THE TRIDUUM

These three days of Holy Week are one continuous celebration of our salvation. They begin with Holy Thursday and end with the Easter Vigil. Parishioners are invited to attend all three days of the Triduum.

On Holy Thursday, parishioners are invited to bring bells to the Mass of the Lord's Supper and ring them during the singing of the Gloria. After Mass there will be a procession to the Chapel where the Blessed Sacrament will be reserved until midnight for adoration.

On Good Friday, confessions will be heard from 12noon until 2:30pm before the celebration of the Lord's Passion and Death at 3pm. In the evening the Stations of the Cross will be recited.

On Saturday after sundown at 7:30pm, the Easter Vigil will commemorate the Resurrection of Christ. At this celebration we will welcome three new members into the Catholic faith.

“THE GREATEST LOVE”

Congratulations to our candidates, Lyndsee Manna, Christopher Flammer and Roy Hinchman who have completed their 1st Reconciliation, The Creed Ceremony and the Stations of the Cross. Did you know that Palm Sunday is the only day in our Catholic calendar when two gospels are read at Mass? The first gospel occurs at the beginning of the Mass and tells of Jesus's entry into Jerusalem, being hailed with "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, the King of Israel." This leads us to the 2nd gospel which is the Passion of Our Lord. If you are baptized Christian then your parents chose to open for you the gift of Christ and His Kingdom. In Baptism you are claimed for Christ and begin the conversion journey of making Him your Savior and King. Have you? Stepping into His Kingdom includes peace and joy along with pain, suffering, forgiveness and mercy. Sometimes it includes climbing onto the Cross with Christ. You are never alone in your suffering – Christ is there. You are never alone in your desolation – Christ is there. Christ went to the Cross so that you would never be alone or abandoned. Christ keeps His promise "never to leave you" and so on Holy Thursday He institutes the great gifts of the Priesthood and the Eucharist. He longs to remain with the one He greatly loves – YOU. Love so great as His can only be repaid with Love. When asked "How much do you love me Lord", Jesus answered, "This Much" then opened His arms and died. How much do you love? Have you met Him in the confessional where you experience His words of love, forgiveness and healing? PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

Isaiah describes the pain and insults of the Servant of God. Yet he sounds hopeful when describing God as his help, knowing he will not be disgraced.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

Paul exults Christ's great sacrifice of humbling himself to become human and die on the cross. He explains that this is why we should now realize the importance of honoring both his name and memory.

Gospel: Mark 14:1—15:47

Mark describes the events leading up to Christ's crucifixion. The Last Supper is described, explaining where the Eucharist began. Judas betrays Jesus and his suffering at the hands of the Sanhedrin (Council) is detailed.
