Our readings today speak to you about "God's Invite". In our first reading from Wisdom, God invites you to a banquet asking you to "forsake foolishness so that you may live and advance in the way of understanding". God invites you to taste and see His goodness by believing Jesus's words in the gospel, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has Eternal Life and I will raise him up on the last day for I am the Living bread that came down from heaven". St. Paul warns you to "watch carefully how you live, making the most of your opportunities, because the days are evil. Do not live in ignorance but try to understand the will of the Lord." Avoid making allowances and excuses in order to justify your lack of reverence, commitment and belief. When you believe in Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist you confirm your acceptance of Our Lord's sacrifice and the gift of Himself at every Mass. **DON'T BE A FOOLISH DOUBTER, BUT BE WISE AND ACCEPT GOD'S INVITE - YOU WILL BE FORMED IN HIS IMAGE AND MADE WORTHY OF EVERLASTING LIFE. TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Proverbs 9:1-6

A rich woman invites many guests to her home to eat and drink. She appeals to those who lack understanding to forsake foolishness and "advance in the way of understanding."

Second Reading: Ephesians 5:15-20

Paul advises the Ephesians to abandon foolish ways and evil deeds. All Christians should concentrate on doing God's will before all other things. He reminds them to always give thanks to God in the name of Jesus Christ.

Gospel: John 6:51-58

Jesus had just told the crowd that anyone who ate of the bread he planned to give would live forever, and that this bread was his flesh, which he would give up for the sake of the world. The people do not understand, but Jesus reassures them that his flesh is real food and that "those who feed on this bread shall live forever."
