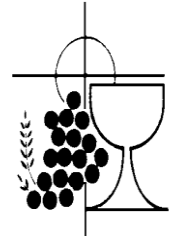

From the Desk of Father Ed:

Dear Parishioners,

When Jesus was beginning his ministry he went into the desert and was tempted by the devil. *He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry. The tempter approached and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command that these stones become loaves of bread." He said in reply, "It is written:*

'One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.'" (Mt 4:3)

In John's Gospel Jesus himself is referred to as the Word of God. The Word that existed before all creation, before all time.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

He was in the beginning with God. (Jn 1:1-2)

Jesus is the Word of God and he is the one who gives us life. In our Gospel today Jesus tells the crowd that he is the "Bread of Life". He is the Word made flesh that gives life to the world. *Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. (Jn 6:53)*

The crowd was demanding a sign from Jesus. Remember how last week's Gospel Jesus gave them an awesome sign where he fed 5,000 people with only 5 Barley loaves and 2 fish but they were still not convinced that he was sent from the Father. In today's Gospel they want to see another sign...a sign like Moses gave to the people when they were hungry in the desert.

Our first reading today is from the Book of Exodus and the people were journeying from their captivity in Egypt and wandering through the desert. The Lord had raised up Moses to free them from their oppression in Egypt where they were enslaved. Moses performed many powerful signs and miracles yet we hear today that the same people grumbled. They were complaining against Moses and against the Lord. They were hungry and so God heard their complaining and gave them food in the desert. The food that he gave them was manna in the morning

and quail in the evening. Manna would come with each morning dew:

"In the morning a dew lay all about the camp, and when the dew evaporated, there on the surface of the desert were fine flakes like hoarfrost on the ground."

Jesus in our Gospel today was trying to convince the crowd that the manna did not come from Moses but rather it came from God. And there is something much greater here. The Father has now sent from Heaven the true Bread, not manna but his only Son to give us life – Life Eternal. Just as he told the crowd some 2,000 years ago that they must believe in him so too we must believe in him. Our faith teaches us that to believe in him means that we must become his disciples. We are to follow him and all his commandments of loving God and neighbor, all the teachings of the Church that He established and to stay close to the Sacraments, which are the source of grace.

In our second reading of St. Paul to the Ephesians we are reminded that we have become a new creation in Christ.

"that you should put away the old self of your former way of life, corrupted through deceitful desires, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth."

Let our hearts and minds thirst for the things of God and not for the things of the earth. Let us do the will of the Father; to believe in his Son, to love Him and follow him...To keep our souls right before him by frequenting the Sacrament of Reconciliation and then dining at the Banquet of the Eucharist – the True Bread from Heaven!

Catechism of the Catholic Church

The fruits of Holy Communion

1391 *Holy Communion augments our union with Christ.* The principal fruit of receiving the Eucharist in Holy Communion is an intimate union with Christ Jesus. Indeed, the Lord said: “He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him.” Life in Christ has its foundation in the Eucharistic banquet: “As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats me will live because of me.” On the feasts of the Lord, when the faithful receive the Body of the Son, they proclaim to one another the Good News that the first fruits of life have been given, as when the angel said to Mary Magdalene, “Christ is risen!” Now too are life and resurrection conferred on whoever receives Christ.

1392 What material food produces in our bodily life, Holy Communion wonderfully achieves in our spiritual life. Communion with the flesh of the risen Christ, a flesh “given life and giving life through the Holy Spirit,” preserves, increases, and renews the life of grace received at Baptism. This growth in Christian life needs the nourishment of Eucharistic Communion, the bread for our pilgrimage until the moment of death, when it will be given to us as viaticum.

1395 By the same charity that it enkindles in us, the Eucharist *preserves us from future mortal sins.* The more we share the life of Christ and progress in his friendship, the more difficult it is to break away from him by mortal sin. The Eucharist is not ordered to the forgiveness of mortal sins—that is proper to the sacrament of Reconciliation. The Eucharist is properly the sacrament of those who are in full communion with the Church.
