The Pastor's Corner

Last Sunday afternoon we held a church renovation update meeting where we gave our parishioners an opportunity to see the latest video of the church interior and to hear some commentary on the state of our project. Included in the presentation was a glimpse of the beautiful mosaic that will serve as the background for the outdoor shrine to Jesus the Good Shepherd. The mosaic portrays various individuals whose lives modeled our Lord's compassionate care for the flock - St. Teresa of Calcutta, Blessed Miriam Terese, Blessed Fulton Sheen, Blessed Dorothy Day, Blessed Giorgio Frassari and Saint Maximilian Kolbe. This last saint was quoted by Catholic Relief Services in a call to action they issued in response to recent executive actions pertaining to immigration: "the greatest poison of our times is indifference." Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has consistently called us to fight against the globalization of indifference by building a culture of encuentro in which we relate to our brothers and sisters throughout the world in a personal and caring way.

As Roman Catholics we are compelled to discern and promote the most compassionate approach to the reality of refugees seeking shelter and immigrants seeking a new home in our country. This means we must be well informed on Catholic social teaching that pertains to this matter. We must have honest and constructive dialogue about the issues and we must pray.

To this end we have made a number of resources available to you through our website at www.svmnj.org. We also will gather on Monday evening, February 6 at 7:30 p.m. in the Parish Ministry Center for discussion and prayer. There is no doubt that this is a complex, moral and ethical dilemma that must be viewed from a faith perspective that considers all aspects of an action executed by our duly elected president, not least of which is the safety of our country and its people. The will of God is most certainly for a harmonious and balanced approach that honors the worth, dignity and value of all His children. May the Holy Spirit lead us to that place.

SVM PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

As many of you know I recently returned from an amazing pilgrimage to the Holy Land. I can still recall the feeling I had as we journeyed from Galilee up to Jerusalem, anticipating being in the city that was at the center of our Lord's passion, death and resurrection. That holy city was also the place where the church was born and went through its early growing pains in defining her mission. That definition was formed at the Council of Jerusalem, where it was determined that the church should fully embrace the Gentiles who professed faith in Christ.

Councils have played an important role in the life of the church all through her history. They are gathering where constructive dialogue takes place and the movement of the Holy Spirit is discerned. So too with our own Pastoral Council, which I am finding to be a tremendous blessing to me in my work as Pastor.

Overview of the by-laws:

The St. Vincent Martyr Parish Pastoral Council is a consultative body of committed parishioners with varied backgrounds, perspectives, skills and talents. The council plans and oversees policies and activities that promote our parish vision statement through prayerful discernment.

To fulfill its purpose, the Council strives to:

- Provide candid advice to the Pastor
- Prayerfully discern the needs of the parish community
- Establish clear and concise goals and objectives to meet the current and emerging needs of the parish community
- Serve as a vehicle for constructive dialogue with the parish community
- Identify and call for the gifts and talents of members of the parish community
- Collaborate with the Parish Staff and Parish Finance Council in serving the parish community

Structure:

The St. Vincent Martyr Parish Pastoral Council is comprised of 12 parishioners who meet monthly, September through June, for staggered three-year terms, having commenced July 1, 2015.

- Fr. George Hundt, one Parish Trustee (currently Barbara Doyle) and one parish staff member (currently Jan Figenshu) are ex-officio members.
- Four (4) of the twelve will leave, these are: Marcela Bledt, Gene Cracovia, Lenore Luckey, and Jerry Schreck.
- Eight (8) of the twelve will stay: Marybeth Bogdanski, Kevin Flanagan, Carol McCarthy, Stan Wisnewski, Jerry Barber, Terrence Gilligan, John Formica, and Gene Picone.
- Four (4) new members will be selected according to the provisions of the By-Laws during Spring 2017 and each succeeding Spring.
- Every member of the parish community who fulfills each of the following three requirements is eligible to serve as a member of the Council:
 - Has received all Sacraments of Initiation
 - Actively practices the Catholic Faith
 - Is a registered member of the Parish for a minimum of 12 months, and is currently an active member of the parish
- Interested candidates will fill out an application, but will not be expected to campaign for a position. The selected four new members will be randomly chosen from the list of finalist candidates. All candidates not chosen by the random selection will be given an opportunity to get involved in another committee or council seeking committed and qualified individuals.

Key Dates:

March 2/12	Pastoral Council Informational and Discernment Meeting (held two dates) This is an informational meeting about the pastoral council and is open to all parishioners, particularly those interested in becoming members themselves or nominating another parishioner. This meeting will address questions raised prospective candidates, and we will share with them in greater depth the expectations for council members. The meeting will include a prayerful reflection on the call to serve. Those who feel called will receive application materials.
April 8	Pastoral Council Applications Final Submission Due Date Candidates submit a short biography, photograph, summary of interest and desire to serve as a member.
May 20/21	Candidate nominees announced to Parishioners via Bulletin(s) The names of accepted candidates will be published in our parish bulletin on three succeeding weekends. Parishioners are invited to provide feedback regarding any candidate.
May 27/28	Pastoral Council new members presented to Parish Fr. George will announce the selected new Council members at all masses this weekend.
Summer	Orientation meeting for Council members

In summary, the term for new members of the Pastoral Council is three years, starting in July, with monthly meetings from September through May. Each year four new members will be selected in the spring. All parishioners are invited to an Informational and Discernment Meeting on the new Parish Pastoral council, scheduled for March 2 at 7:30 p.m. or March 12 at 3:00 p.m. The date for submitting an application for one of the four open membership positions is on or before Saturday, April 8. The selection of the four new members will be announced at masses on the weekend of May 27/28.

This is an excellent opportunity for four new members to participate in the Pastoral Council to work with our pastor for the good of our parish, assuring that we live up to our Vision Statement: *That we are a welcoming, diverse Catholic community that share the love of Jesus Christ through prayer, ministry, education and service.*




SNOW POLICY/INCLEMENT WEATHER FOR DAILY MASS

V Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Primera Lectura: Isa. 58, 7-10

Lo que Dios quiere, como ayuno, como mortificación, es no cerrarse al prójimo. Con ello se revelan las causas de la situación, la falta de identificación con el que sufre, el no sentirnos afectados personalmente por el hambre, la desnudez o la pobreza de los otros, considerando esos hechos como datos fríos de noticias o de encuestas sociológicas.

Segunda Lectura: 1Cor 2, 1-5

La segunda lectura nos muestra la fuerza del poder más pobre del mundo: la cruz, la sabiduría de la cruz, del fracaso. Maravilloso pasaje donde Pablo expresa la convicción de que Jesucristo, el crucificado, es el libertador de los oprimidos.

Evangelio: San Mateo 5, 13-16

El evangelista Mateo nos presenta el papel del cristiano de ser sal y luz del mundo. El cristiano que pierde la sal es el que no puede resistir viviendo en la opción de las bienaventuranzas.

Tiempo Ordinario: Un caminar con Jesús

Este Tiempo Ordinario se divide como en dos "tandas". Una primera, desde después de la Epifanía y el bautismo del Señor hasta el comienzo de la Cuaresma. Y la

segunda, desde después de Pentecostés hasta el Adviento. Les invito a aprovechar este Tiempo Ordinario con gran fervor, con esperanza, creciendo en las virtudes teologales. Es tiempo de gracia y salvación. Encontraremos a Dios en cada rincón de nuestro día. Basta tener ojos de fe para descubrirlo, no vivir miopes y encerrados en nuestro egoísmo y problemas. Dios va a pasar por nuestro camino.
