The Pastor's Corner

This past Monday evening more than 50 of our parishioners gathered for an evening of discussion and prayer surrounding the immigration and refugee issues in which our nation is currently involved. We began with each of the participants introducing themselves and sharing why they were there. It became quickly evident that there was a diversity of opinions on the matter.

While the sharing was not without deep feeling it was also respectful and open minded, a refreshing change from the name calling and insult hurling that we see in so many other exchanges. We took time that evening to learn about the Catholic Church's teaching on the basic principles of social justice and how that applied to the matter of refugees seeking asylum and migrants seeking a new home in our country. (See today's bulletin insert) The discussion that followed showed that there were different ideas about what approach we as a church should take in response to this challenging topic.

The discussion also brought to light the need to take this dialogue further and to involve more parishioners in that conversation. Some of those in attendance volunteered to work together with me in developing a plan to make that happen. As we prayed a decade of the rosary to conclude the evening I thought about how easy it is to speak about refugees and immigrants as a problem and to lose sight of them as people, fellow children of God, brothers and sisters in the human family. Remembering this is key to finding a way to treat these men, women and children with respect and to journey with them to the fullness of God's kingdom - a kingdom of justice, peace and love.

Saint Valentine, officially known as Saint Valentine of Rome, is a third-century Roman saint widely celebrated on February 14 and commonly associated with "courtly love." The romantic nature of Valentine's Day may have derived during the Middle Ages, when it was believed that birds coupled in mid-February.

According to English 18th-century antiquarians Alban Butler and Francis Douce, Valentine's Day was most likely created to overpower the pagan holiday, Lupercalia. Whoever he was, St. Valentine did really exist, because archaeologists have unearthed a Roman catacomb and an ancient church dedicated to St. Valentine. In 496 AD, Pope Gelasius marked February 14th as a celebration in honor of his martyrdom. Although the exact origin of the holiday is not widely agreed upon, it is widely recognized as a day for love, devotion and romance.

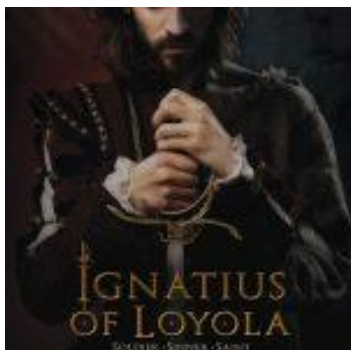
