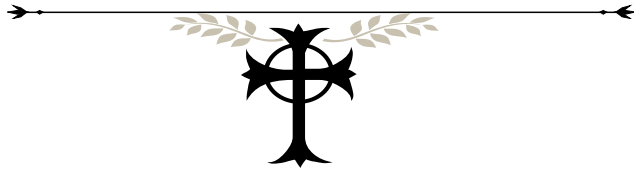

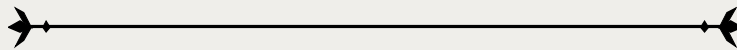

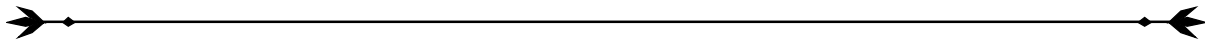

- **SCREENING** of staff/volunteers.
- Adults trained in **SAFE ENVIRONMENT** strategies and signs of abuse.
- **CODE OF CONDUCT** enforced.
- Open **COMMUNICATION** between parents and staff/staff and children/children and parents.
- Parents always **WELCOME**.
- Children educated in **RIGHT RELATIONSHIPS** and what to do if a relationship isn't right.
- All children treated with **DIGNITY AND RESPECT**.
- Clear **RULES AND EXPECTATIONS**. Consistent reinforcement/ consequences.
- **ADEQUATE SUPERVISION** of youth. Team approach – accountability – no 1:1 isolation.
- All **ABUSE IS REPORTED**.

#### **José de Arimatea: La Obra de Caridad**

Continuamos nuestra  
reflexión del libro De la Cruz a la  
Tumba Vacía, de nuestro obispo  
Serratelli, traducido a nuestra  
lengua. Estas semanas estaremos  
leyendo el Capítulo 12.

“Los judíos creían que lo  
peor de morir como un criminal, era  
dejar el cadáver de la persona  
expuesta a la vergüenza y a la  
humillación. Esto provocó que se  
cometiera la deshonra pública  
añadida de que su carne fuera  
devorada por aves silvestres. El  
castigo de estar ahorcado en un  
árbol y dejarlo al libre albedrío, se  
pensaba que era tan severo, que  
estaba reservado solo para “es  
maldición de Dios” (ver

Deuteronomio 21, 23). Pablo expone  
sobre esto cuando dice: “Cristo nos  
ha rescatado de la maldición de la  
ley, haciéndose Él mismo maldición  
por nosotros, pues dice la escritura:  
“Maldito el que cuelga en un árbol”  
(Gálatas 3, 13-14).

La ley judía amortiguó su  
justicia con misericordia. La  
humillación en la memoria del  
criminal ejecutado y su familia no  
debe ser excesiva. La ley exigía que  
“Si un hombre, reo de delito capital,  
ha sido ejecutado, lo colgarás de un  
árbol. Pero no dejarás que se  
cadáver pase la noche en el árbol; lo  
enterrarás el mismo día, porque un  
colgado es una maldición de Dios. Así  
no harás impuro el suelo que Yahvé  
tu Dios te va a dar en herencia”  
(Deuteronomio 21, 22-23).

Esta ley, esta misericordia, es lo que  
impulsa a José de Arimatea a ir  
donde Pilato y pedir el cuerpo de  
Jesús. Él quiere sepultar a Jesús  
antes del atardecer del Viernes  
Santo”.

Continuaremos la próxima semana  
con este capítulo.
